A talented Klamath Falls girl who has in the past six years risen steadily in the opera circles of Italy has recently added another rung to her ladder of success.

Athena Lampropoulos, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gust Lampropoulos, is presently singing in Tel Aviv with the Israel National Opera Company. Press reviews received by her family attest to the enthusiastic and appreciative responses received by Athena for her leading roles in the three operas presented this season, La Traviata, Don Giovanni and Aida.

The past four years Athena has studied at Milan with continued success in appearances throughout Italy and Switzerland.

It was during an engagement in Venice this summer that a young girl conductor from Israel heard Athena sing and was so impressed that she suggested the singer write to the Israel National Opera Company.

The letter was answered by a telephone call from Madame DePhillippe, founder, producer and director of the Israel National Opera Company, who invited Athena to Tel Aviv immediately.

Although the contract offered was for one year, Athena signed only for six months. Her family has not yet heard her decision for the remaining six months, but if a repeat performance presented Dec. 12 is indicative of her appeal to Israeli audiences, doubtless she will remain in Tel Aviv for the full contract time.
