Honduras, Dominican Win U.S. Recognition

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The United States Saturday formally resumed diplomatic relations with Honduras and the Dominican Republic. Recognition had been withdrawn after military coups in both countries.

The State Department announced that diplomatic notes were sent Saturday formally recognizing the governments which came to power following a military coup in Honduras Oct. 3 and a similar coup in the Dominican Republic Sept. 25.

U.S. officials said, however, that no decision has yet been made on resuming aid to the two countries, to return economic or military aid missions or to return U.S. ambassadors. All were withdrawn following the coups.

Officials said these additional steps would be considered later. They indicated they would depend on continued progress of regimes in the two countries.

Red China Claims U.S. Doesn't Dare Risk War

PARIS (UPI) — Red China's Foreign Minister Chen Yi said today he sees no prospect of a third world war "for the moment" because the United States would not dare risk one.

In an interview, Chen said Latin America, Asia and Africa must be united against America and its European allies to insure peace.

"The danger of war still exists, as long as imperialism exists," he said.

Chen said the United States has isolated itself from most wars in the past "until the situation became favorable enough to profit by them."

The United States "won nothing" by its speedy confrontation of communism in Korea, he said.

"U.S. intervention in Korea was a bad business for the Americans," he said. "They lost face."

"The U.S. does not dare declare war now is it pleases because of the power of the Communist bloc," he said.

"If they want to start a war they will have to do it themselves. They will be completely isolated."

Opposed Lawyers Wage Spirited Verbal Battle

DALLAS (UPI) — Doggedly opposed lawyers in the Jack Ruby murder trial waged a spirited out-of-court battle Saturday over the only legal case resulting thus far from President Kennedy's assassination.

Ruby, 32, charged with killing suspected assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, was shielded from the attorneys' jousting by jail bars and a heavy guard. The lawyers' exchanges were through news media.

Plans Set To Guard President

NEW YORK (UPI) — President Johnson's second visit to New York City within 10 days has once more set into motion maximum security measures of unprecedented proportions.

Johnson is scheduled to fly here from Washington next Tuesday to address the United Nations' General Assembly. The President made a trip to New York last Sunday to attend funeral services for the late New York Senator Herbert H. Lehman.

It was the Chief Executive's first trip to New York as President. It came so soon after the Nov. 22 assassination of President Kennedy that security-conscious officials marshaled more than 6,000 policemen, policemen, FBI and Secret Service agents to protect Johnson.

Security was so tight that even veteran newsmen at Idlewild Airport, well known to local security officials, were barred from the area where Johnson's plane landed.

Similar precautions will be taken for the Tuesday visit, according to an announcement Friday by Deputy Police Commissioner Walter Arm.

Johnson's visit to the city on Sunday, Dec. 8 lasted less than two hours: The planned trip Tuesday also will be of short duration with the President heading back immediately to Washington.

Head Of Grange Looks For Wheat Legislation By March 1

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The president of the National Grange said Friday he believes there is "an excellent chance" Congress will act on wheat legislation before March 1.

Herchel Newsum made his prediction at a news conference after a grange-sponsored meeting of nine big farm organizations. Of the nine farm groups only the American Farm Bureau Federation was not represented at the two-day meeting.

The Farm Bureau wound up its annual convention Thursday at Chicago.

President Johnson has called a meeting of national farm leaders for Dec. 18 to discuss wheat and cotton legislation. Meeting with Johnson and Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman will be spokesmen for the Farm Bureau, the Grange, the National Farmers Union, the National Farmers Organization, the National Federation of Farmers Cooperative, and the Cooperative League of the U.S.A.

Newsum, flanked by representatives of the organizations at the grange-sponsored meeting, said the group "commended the action of the House wheat subcommittee in beginning new congressional hearings now leading to the immediate development of a program for the 1964 wheat crop."

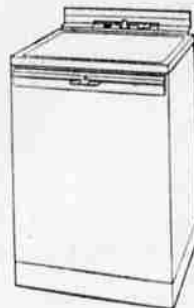
