# Plan Would Aid High-Bracket Group

WASHINGTON (UPI)—About 14,000 high-bracket taxpayers stand to gain a tax break if Congress approves an amendment to the tax bill that the treasury estimates will cut government income by \$45 million.

The amendment would permit taxpayers earning \$50,000 or more a year to pay a maximum rate of 50 per cent on their incomes. The present rate is 91 per cent.

But, the "simplified" system would at the same time disallow all personal deductions, such as interest, medical expenses, charitable contributions and most tax credits and exclusions.

The plan was approved by the Senate Finance Committee Friday in its first major vote on the \$11.1 billion tax-cutting bill already approved by the House.

The proposal was added to the House bill, and there were strong indications it would be dropped next year when the Senate votes, or in House-Senate deliberations on a compromise measure.

The Treasury Department was known to be lukewarm, at best, in its support of the plan. The proposal specifies that single taxpayers may pay a flat 40 per cent on their first \$50,000 of income, or the first \$100,000 for married couples filing a joint return. They would pay 50 per cent on all additional income.

## Big Soviet Rocket Predicted

NEW ORLEANS (UPI)—Dr. Werner Von Braun, scientific spark of U.S. space efforts, said Friday he thinks the Russians are building a super rocket that will dwarf any flown before.

"We would be foolish to think they are standing still," he said.

Von Braun made his remarks while here to accept the first huge Saturn S-1 booster built by private industry for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

The booster was modeled after one built by NASA that is expected to be launched in January from Cape Kennedy, orbiting 19 tons of empty casing.

Von Braun said it would be the biggest satellite launched in a single firing. He said last week he would "not be surprised" if the Russians soon would orbit 40-50 tons.

# Attacks On Court Not New

PORTLAND (UPI)—The President of the American Bar Association said Friday night the current controversy around the U.S. Supreme Court, and particularly the attacks against Chief Justice Earl Warren, are nothing new in court history.

Walter E. Craig, Phoenix, Ariz., said the character of the court's business makes for sharp divisions in the court and involves it in public debate.

He said the judicial body does not choose the cases which come before it, but contended its decisions were predictable from previous action of the court and were consistent with prior rulings.

He said the 1954 case which outlawed "separate but equal schools" and the more recent school prayer ruling as could have been predicted from previous actions of the court.

Craig addressed a joint meeting of the Oregon Circuit Court Judges Association and the Multnomah County Bar Association on the functions of the Supreme Court.
