

Field Generals Pace Final Grid Statistics

NEW YORK (UPI) — Navy quarterback Roger Staubach has all the headlines, but George Mira and Don Trull have two of the most coveted individual championships in college football.

Mira wound up the season as the leader in total offense thanks to his 324-yard performance last weekend in Miami's 17-12 loss to Alabama, the final NCAA Service Bureau statistics disclosed today.

The Miami quarterback, who has signed with the San Francisco Forty Niners, totaled 2,318 yards in 10 games. Trull, of Baylor, was second with 2,276 yards. Jerry Rhome of Tulsa was third with 1,976 and Staubach was fourth with 1,822. Terry Isaacson of Air Force completed the top five with 1,747.

Trull, who leads Baylor against LSU in the Bluebonnet Bowl Saturday, was the nation's leading passer, edging Mira by a scant two yards and two more completions.

Wilt Nears NBA Lead

NEW YORK (UPI) — Wilt Chamberlain has had his whack at playmaking. Now he's back on scoring target and the San Francisco Warriors are at the 500 percentage mark.

Chamberlain moved to within 18 points of leading scorer Oscar Robertson of Cincinnati by way of a three-game spree against Baltimore. Will tallied 156 points against the Bullets that brought his season's total to 879 in National Basketball Association games through Sunday.

The San Francisco skyscraper took over the lead in rebounds with 572 and maintained his field goal percentage lead with a mark of .521 on 559 of 689 attempts.

Pirates Deal For Lefty

PITTSBURGH (UPI) — The Pittsburgh Pirates purchased lefthanded relief pitcher Bob Allen from the Cleveland Indians Monday and sold outfielder Larry Elliot to the New York Mets.

Both transactions were made on a conditional basis.

Allen, 26, a native of Tatum, Tex., is a resident of Henderson, Tex., and has been in professional ball since 1957. He spent most of the past three seasons with Cleveland, compiling a 3-5 record, all in relief.

Last year Allen appeared in 43 games for the Indians and posted a 1-2 record. He gave up 58 hits in 56 innings and logged an earned run average of 4.66. His lifetime ERA is 4.30.

Elliot, also 26, was assigned to the Mets' Buffalo farm club in the International League. He will report to the Mets' early instructional camp Feb. 5 and attend spring training with the Mets.

A native of San Diego, Calif., Elliot played in 124 games for Columbus of the International League last season and batted .252. Lefthanded all the way, he had 106 hits and drove in 81 runs.

Shockers Blast Texas, 76-57; Indiana, Loyola Collect Wins

The Longhorns whose five straight victories had lifted them into the No. 8 spot in the country in the latest United Press International ratings, finally took one on the chin Monday night. Powerful Wichita (No. 12) crushed Texas with consummate ease, 76-57.

The Shockers, twice upset victims this year in seven games, played their strongest game of the season as five players hit double figures. Dave Stallworth, a 6-foot-7 All-America candidate scored 16 points to pace Wichita.
