Oregon State Ranked Seventh; Loyola Leads, With Michigan, 'Cats Closing

NEW YORK (UPI) — Loyola of Chicago, the top-ranked major college basketball power, gets a much-needed shot in its national rankings after Christmas—a hyped schedule.

The unbeaten Ramblers have been losing ground and votes—but not games—steadily since the opening of the season but Monday managed to retain their first-place standing for the fifth consecutive week in the United Press International board of coaches ratings.

Loyola hasn't played a ranking team this season. The Ramblers have averaged over 100 points per game in crushing five foes, but only one of the five (Detroit, 4-3) has a winning record and combined the five opponents have lost 22 of 35 games.

Michigan, ranked second, and third-rated Kentucky have taken advantage of rougher schedules to improve their prestige and close within 33 and 35 points, respectively, of Loyola.

However, the Ramblers will meet improved competition in the Quaker City Tournament beginning Friday in Philadelphia then tackle several Big Ten and Missouri Valley outfits.

Loyola was ranked first by 22 of the 35 coaches on the UPI board while Michigan and Kentucky received six ballots each. Davidson, rated eighth, received the other first-place rating. Cincinnati, recovering from

its upset by Kansas, mounted a new three-game winning streak and moved back into fourth place. UCLA and Vanderbilt, two of the six unbeaten teams in the top 10, jumped up to fifth and sixth, respectively.

Oregon State whipped Indiana twice last week to climb to seventh just ahead of Davidson. Duke, which lost to Michigan last week, fell to ninth and NYU, upset by Wagner, fell to 10th. Both teams have lost twice.

West coach Jim Sutherland again had the air filled with footballs as West quarterbacks Don Trull of Baylor and Bill Munson of Utah State Monday passed through a long morning drill.

Sutherland was so pleased with the workout that he gave his troops the afternoon off.

While ends Vern Burke of Oregon State and Mel Profit of UCLA shagged their share of long passes, there was a special emphasis on quick pitches to speedsters Willie Brown of USC and Charlie Taylor of Arizona State.

Each can go all the way any time he turns the corner and it appears the West may try to click on short tosses and take their chances on the open field ability of the flanker backs.

At the East camp, defensive coach Ben Schwartzwalder was the happiest of the coaching staff after his pass defense stood up well in practice air drills. Halfbacks Paul Warfield of Ohio State and Paul Martha of Pittsburgh were especially difficult to pass over or in front of.

The East took two drills Monday.

LA Classic Nears Start

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — A field that includes some of the top-ranking basketball teams in the nation was converging here today for the fifth annual Los Angeles Basketball Classic which gets under way Thursday.

Included among the top contenders were three teams listed in the first ten by the United Press International board of coaches in their weekly ratings.

These nationally-rated quintets are headed by undefeated Michigan, listed second only to Loyola of Chicago; unbeaten UCLA, rated 3th and defending champion in the tournament; and 10th ranked New York University, one of the best in the East.

The Big Ten also is represented by its defending co-champion, Illinois, while the Ivy League's honors will be upheld by a strong Yale University team. Pittsburgh heads the Eastern independent teams and the others competing are West Virginia and University of Southern California.

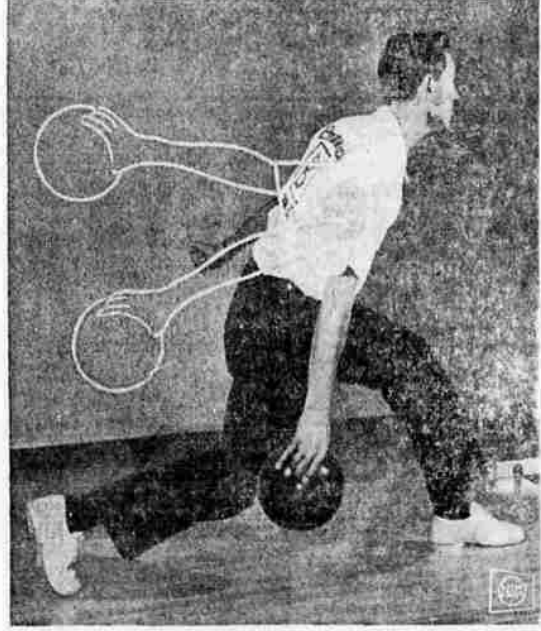

10 — Pendulum Swing

As the old song says, "It don't mean a thing if you ain't got that swing" — pendulum swing, that is.

Billy Golembiewski has a pendulum swing that would do credit to the finest grandfather's clock, which is exactly what it is fashioned after. The truly great swing, such as Billy G's, is as smooth and effortless as the movement of the pendulum on an old-fashioned hall timepiece.

When you have learned to swing as the clock pendulum swings, you have more than half the problems of bowling completely licked. The pendulum swing begins when the left hand has taken leave of the ball at the finish of the push-away and the first step.

The arm should swing freely, extended, taking its natural arc under the weight of the ball which, paradoxically enough, seems to become almost weightless when the swing is performed properly. You might almost say the ball swings itself, finding a natural speed without any help or mechanical action on your part.

If you master the pendulum swing and learn to keep it straight toward your target throughout, you will be a long way on the road to becoming
