A few opinions voiced mainly in the East that Navy should be ranked above Texas have filtered down Texas way in recent weeks.

In addition to featuring the two top teams in the nation, the Cotton Bowl game will see the UPI "lineman of the year," Scott Appleton, going against the UPI "back and player of the year," Navy quarterback Roger Staubach.

**Well Known In Texas**  
The Middle signal caller is becoming just about as well known among Texas players as their own famous coach, Darrell Royal. Ask any member of the team or any coach about Staubach, and they settle down for some serious discussion that includes all the adjectives used to describe a great player.

"He certainly passes as well as Baylor's Don Trull and is a much better runner," said defensive Coach Miles Campbell.

"He's the spitting image of Don Meredith plus the fact that he runs much better than Don could. He's something. He's an exciting football player."

Defensive line Coach Charley Shira said the Staubach threat was "greatly increased" by the ability of Navy ends David Stuggerud and Jim Campbell.

Both Campbell and Shira said Texas will stick to its defensive pattern used throughout the season in the game with Navy.

**Stick With Pattern**  
"We'd be fools to change our defensive pattern after winning

10 games with it," Campbell said. But he said he and his crew were reconciled to the fact that "you just can't stop Navy's attack."

"They're too fine a team for anybody to stop them," Campbell said. "The best we can hope for is to slow them down."

Texas relies mainly on its ground game, headed by tailback Tommy Ford, the South-

west Conference's top ground gainer with 738 yards and a 4.6 average, and called by quarterback Duke Carlisle.

Carlisle works from the old-fashioned split-T. But he also does some defensive chores, and one of his great moments in this department was a last-minute interception of a Trull pass against Baylor that saved Texas' undefeated streak and kept them at the top of the national rankings.

## Sponsor Seeking New Fight Network

**NEW YORK (UPI)**—The principal sponsor of nationally televised fights insisted today it wished the telecasts to continue but admitted no network could be found to carry the bouts after September.

Craig Smith, vice president in charge of advertising for the Gillette Safety Razor Company, said his firm—18-year sponsor of televised boxing—"regretted wholeheartedly" that the American Broadcasting Company would drop the weekly fights in September.

"Our own organization has been so well satisfied with televised boxing as an advertising

medium," Smith explained. "that we wish we could form our own network of stations to continue it, but I guess that would be impossible."

Smith stressed that the Gillette company was not dissatisfied with Friday night ratings.

He added: "In our opinion the audiences have been very loyal to us and to boxing and we don't like to deprive them of fights in the future."

Asked when the fights would be dropped by ABC, Smith replied: "We have separate contracts with ABC and with the Madison Square Garden Boxing Corporation. It is my recollection that both contracts expire in September."

A spokesman for ABC confirmed that "we have no plans to continue our weekly boxing shows next season."

## The Stilt Scoring

**NEW YORK (UPI)**—Wilt Chamberlain no longer is a shadow of his former self.

Chamberlain, the National Basketball Association defending scoring champion, finally returned to his old spot as point leader with 1,921 in games through Sunday, league statistics showed today.

The San Francisco Warrior displaced Cincinnati's Oscar Robertson, who fell to third with 941 points as Bob Pettit of St. Louis took over the runner-up slot with 967.

Chamberlain's surge forward also enabled him to retain his field goal percentage lead with a .529 mark on 417 of 789 attempts. Jerry Lucas of Cincinnati is second with a .513 percentage on 220 for 429.

The 7-foot-1 Chamberlain maintained his rebounding lead with 679. Bill Russell of Boston has 623 retrieves and Lucas 551.

## 10—The Follow Through

Convince yourself that the delivery hasn't been completed until the ball hits the pins.

The thought may help you complete the follow through.

If you fail to follow through, the arm may jerk the ball to the right or left and send it off target. The follow through is a natural finish for the pendulum swing. Let the arm take its natural course after the ball has been released.

Follow through so that the arm bisects the 1-3 pocket. The follow through should bring the rolling arm to at least eye level. Some professionals place so much stress on the follow through they suggest that you press until the rolling arm is in a hat-tipping position.

Applying a determined follow through helps impart a nat-

ural twist to the ball, giving it pin-spilling action.

## Canadiens' Beliveau Leading NHL Scoring

**MONTREAL (UPI)**—Jean Beliveau of the Montreal Canadiens took over the lead in the National Hockey League's individual scoring race today in games played through Sunday.

Beliveau scored 15 goals and 30 assists for 45 points — one point ahead of Bobby Hull and Stan Mikita of Chicago. Hull's tally was 20-24-44 while Mikita had scored 19 goals and 25 assists.

Hull, who has equalled the 50 goals in one season scored by retired Maurice Richard and Bernie Gorrion of the Canadiens, was the first player to hit the 20-goal mark this season.

Another Black Hawk, Ken Wharram, was fourth with 34 points, followed by New York's Andy Bathgate with 33.

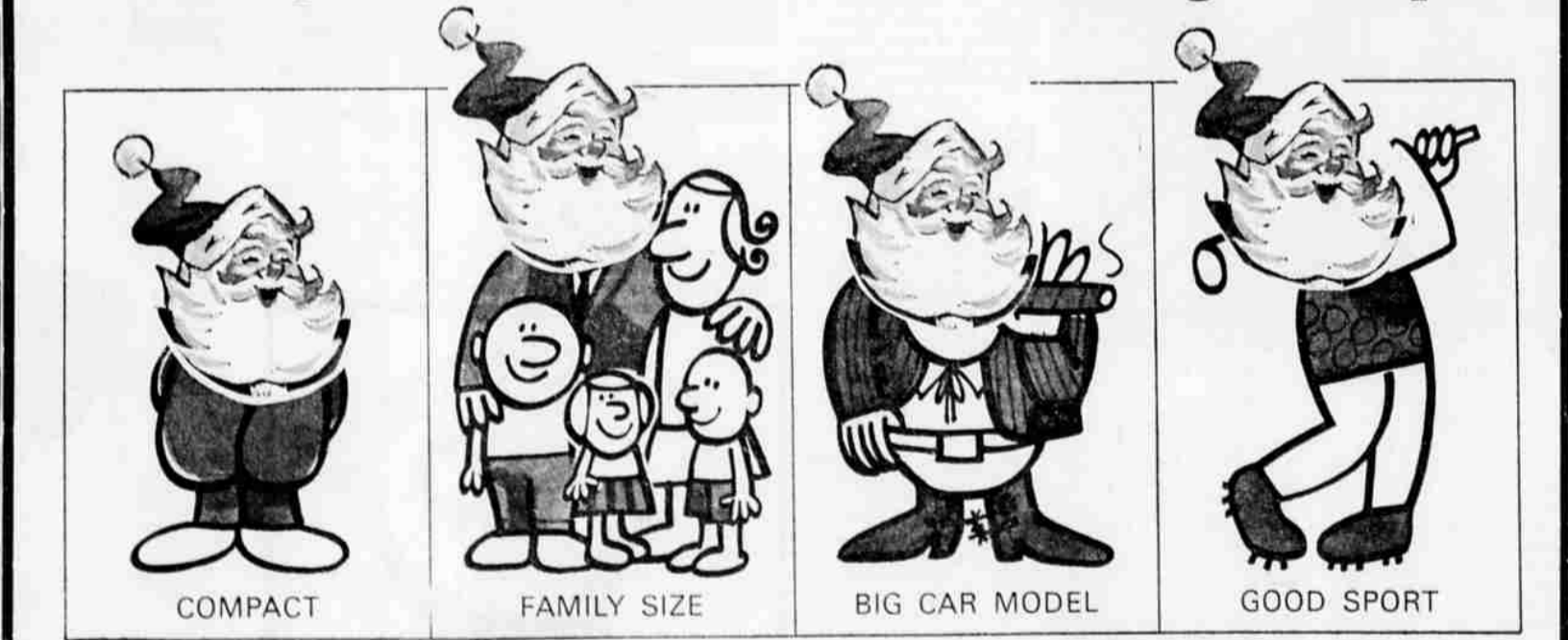
