Nehru Says Fleet Help Not Needed

NEW DELHI (UPI)—Premier Jawaharlal Nehru said Saturday India needs no help from the U.S. 7th Fleet, some of whose ships recently have been ordered into the Indian Ocean.

"There is no question of any foreign ships or foreign troops or foreign aircraft participating in the actual defense of the country," Nehru told parliament.

"This defense will be effected only by the Indian armed forces and the people of this country."

The premier said he sees no objection to the presence of the U.S. warships in the Indian Ocean. He denied reports that the Soviet Embassy had "expressed concern" about the matter.
