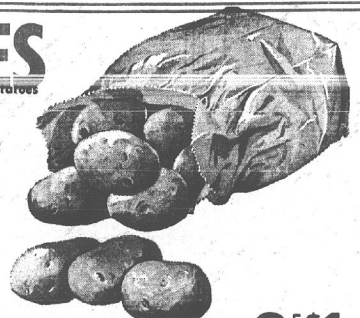

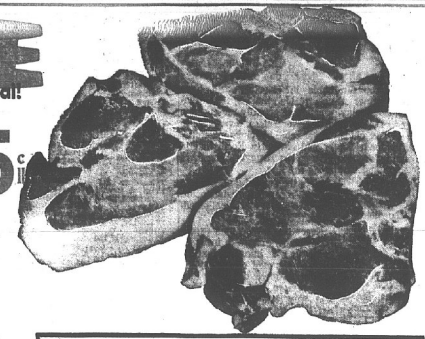

**Weed Winner**

WEED -- Shirley Renning, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Orville Renning of Weed, has been named 1965 Weed High School's Homemaking of Tomorrow. Weed's senior winning contestant scored highest in a written homemaking examination taken by senior girls on Dec. 1, 1964, and is now eligible for state and national honors. Test papers of each state's Homemakers of Tomorrow are being judged. Winners will receive a \$1,500 scholarship. State runners-up receive a \$800 educational grant. In addition, the school the State Homemaking of Tomorrow attends will receive a complete set of the Encyclopedia Britannica. All state winners are eligible for a week-long tour of Colonial Williamsburg, Va., Washington, D.C., and New York City. Climax of the week-long tour is the naming of the Betty Crocker All-American Homemaking of Tomorrow for a scholarship award of \$5,000. This year's contest, which was initiated by General Mills in 1954, has seen more than a half million senior girls in more than 14,000 high schools participate in the program's 11-year history.

**Chicken In-The-Pot**

Using a Dutch oven, large skillet or an attractive casserole which can be brought to table, make Sunday dinner easier with this vegetable-chicken recipe. If you prefer, the dish can be cooked in advance and reheated at dinner time.

**BRAISED CHICKEN AND FRESH VEGETABLES** (Serves 6 to 8)  
3 to 4 lb. ready-to-cook chicken  
2 tablespoons shortening  
2 cups boiling water  
3 teaspoons salt  
12 small white onions, peeled  
2 cups celery, cut into 1-inch pieces  
1/2 cup green pepper, cut into 1/2-inch dice  
1 cup fresh snap beans, cut into 1-inch pieces  
1 cup carrots, cut into 1/2-inch slices  
1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper  
2 tablespoons flour  
4 tablespoons cold water  
1/2 cup pimiento strips  
Wash chicken and cut into 1/2-inch size pieces. Brown in all sides in hot shortening in Dutch oven or saucapan. Add boiling water and salt. Cover and cook 10 minutes. Add onions, celery and green pepper.  
Cover and cook 40 minutes, or until vegetables are tender. Add beans, carrots and black pepper 15 minutes before cooking time is up.  
Blend flour with cold water to a smooth paste. Add and cook 1 to 2 minutes. Add pimiento. Serve hot.
