

Red China Offers Aid To Fight Imperialists

TOKYO (UPI)—Communist China has pledged to come to the aid of Indonesia if American and British "imperialists" forced war over Malaysia, it was reported today.

The communique also said Chinese Premier Chou En-lai had accepted with pleasure an invitation from President Sukarno to visit Jakarta in April.

The promise was made in a joint communique issued at the conclusion of Indonesian Foreign Minister Subandrio's visit to Peking for talks with Chinese officials.

As reported by the official Communist New China News Agency, in a dispatch monitored in Tokyo, Indonesia and China decided to "strengthen their technical cooperation, expand their trade, develop maritime transportation between them and strengthen their friendly contacts in the military field."

It said that the two sides had concluded an agreement on economic and technical cooperation and a credit arrangement.

No details were disclosed. In Jakarta, the official Antara news agency quoted for its office spokesman G. P. Harsono as saying in Peking that Subandrio received a pledge from China to extend a \$100-million credit to Indonesia.

Harsono said Subandrio's mission to Peking was a success. The communique did not say whether China would send troops and weapons to help Sukarno carry out his pledge to crush the federation of Malaysia.

It echoed Sukarno's denunciation of Malaysia as a "military base which poses a direct menace to Indonesia, a military base for aggression in Southeast Asia."

Drink Probe Promised

SALEM (UPI)—An investigation into possible teenage drinking on ships and airliners was promised Wednesday by Sen. Al Flegel, D-Roseburg. He told the Senate Alcoholic Control Committee he had evidence that liquor was served to teenagers at a party on a Navy ship "now in drydock in Portland."

Flegel said he also had reports that liquor was offered to teenagers aboard a Portland-bound commercial airliner from Hawaii, and that some teenagers became intoxicated.

State Liquor Administrator D. E. Barnick told Flegel the Liquor Control Commission opposed any such teenage drinking. Barnick said the airlines had been cooperative, and that in cases involving the Navy the commission is usually dealt through the shore patrol.
