### History Unit Picks Chief

Cecil R. Lake of Klamath Falls has been elected to a two-year term as president of the Crater Lake National History Association, Inc. The association's fourteen-member board of directors took this action at its annual meeting in Crater Lake National Park, July 27. Lake succeeds Frank J. Van Dyke of Medford who has just completed four years as president of the association.

Lake is an assistant professor in the Department of Arts and Sciences and the Department of Institutional Research at Oregon Technical Institute. He has contributed significantly to the association by advising on the maintenance of its financial records.

Conservation is a subject of particular interest and concern to Lake, whose recreation often includes fishing, hunting and hunting. He has been heard to state that Crater Lake's rainbow trout are among the best in the state, despite their landlocked existence. However, the similarity between his name and that of the park's central feature is entirely coincidental.

The Crater Lake National History Association, Inc., is a non-profit organization cooperating with and assisting the National Park Service at Crater Lake National Park and Oregon Caves National Monument. Primary objectives of the association include the acquisition of materials and equipment needed in the operation of the park, especially the maintenance of the park; the development and maintenance of the park library; and the preservation of documents and other objects pertinent to the park.

### Treasurer Gains Word On Savings

Eva Cook, Klamath County treasurer, received information on how to save local taxpayers thousands of dollars at a municipal bond rating briefing session recently in the office of State Treasurer Robert W. Straub.

Two municipal bond rating experts, William McCarthy Moody's Investors Service and James Kull, the firm's West Coast representative from Seattle, met in Salem at Straub's invitation with 18 county, city and school district finance officers from all over the state.

Ways in which counties and special service districts which finance construction projects through municipal bonds can obtain the best possible ratings for their bonds were explained. Moody's Investors Service collects information about counties, cities and special districts in order to establish the municipal bond ratings which determine how much interest these bonds can command.

When local officials know what kind of current information is needed by ratings experts, the bond ratings often can be improved to provide substantial savings, Straub said.

The meeting of the treasurer's office was a result of consultations between Straub and New York financial authorities when he was in New York earlier this month to sign Oregon bonds there.
