MOSCOW, Idaho (UPI) — Coaching position at the University of Idaho, a hard-nosed defensive specialist, has been elevated to the head football coach of the Idaho Vandals.

Musseau, 41, was named Tuesday to succeed Dee Anderson, who resigned Monday to accept the head coaching position at Oregon State University.

Musseau, a graduate of Louisiana State University, came to Idaho in 1962 as an assistant to Anderson. As chief Vandal assistant under Anderson, he served as a defensive specialist and did much of the recruiting.

He came to Idaho from Oregon State Junior College at Santa Ana, Calif.

Local Skiers Make Good Showings

Rusty Robinson, Klamath Falls, a member of the All-Mage Ski Club, finished third in the Junior Novice races conducted at Mt. Ashland early this week.

In the girls Junior Novice event, Jean Thompson, Klamath Falls, placed third with a combined time of 138.0 seconds.

In the nine and under age group of Mitty-Mites, Sally Aldrich missed first place honors by five tenths of a second.

First place in the girls race went to Sandra Ashmon of Bend with a time of 90.9 seconds.

Tam Ward finished fifth in the 10-12-year-old group of Mitty-Mite girl races, and Sid Ward finished seventh, followed by Mike Bilyeu in the boys Mitty-Mite races.

Chinook Planting Slated

A massive planting program involving 4.5 million fall chinook salmon fingerlings from the Oregon Fish Commission hatcheries is aimed at the Willamette River tributaries over the next two months, the first 400,000 released recently in the lower Molalla River.

Other waters slated for liberation are the North Santiam and South Santiam rivers and upper mainstem Willamette River.

The translocation of fall chinook salmon to the Willamette is also in contemplation of the proposed \$18 million highway at Willamette Falls near Oregon City. Subject to availability of federal funds the highway is tentatively scheduled for completion in the summer of 1966.

BAN EFFECTIVE — BOWIE, Md. (UPI) — The Maryland Racing Commission's ban on the twin double for the state's three major tracks, Bowie, Laurel and Pimlico, became effective today.

The ruling stemmed from a near riot at Bowie Friday when twin double fans demanded their money back after the better horse in an entry was scratched.
