St. Barnabas Episcopal Church

Bonanza, Ore., Langell Valley

LANGELL VALLEY... In 1929 a group of people interested in starting an Episcopal church met with Rev. J. Henry Thomas, vicar of St. Pauls Episcopal Church in Klamath Falls to see what could be done.

A few meetings were held in homes with a portable altar, then services were held in the Langell Valley community hall each Sunday afternoon.

The first baptism was Richard Owen Pepple, son of Betty and Owen Pepple March 31, 1929.

In 1930 Dave Turner gave an acre of ground and the canvas to raise funds for the construction of a church was started.

The details of the plan were worked out by Howard Perrin, local architect of Klamath Falls who donated his services. Rev. Thomas modified the plans to fit the needs of Langell Valley. A model of the church was constructed by Mr. Robinson of the Klamath Cabinet Shop and was later displayed in Denver as an ideal rural church.

Rev. Thomas traveled extensively through New York and Massachusetts and told of the great needs of the Western Missions, many of which

had their beginning at that time. His tireless efforts on behalf of St. Barnabas resulted in a great deal of assistance from several Eastern Parishes.

A Women's group of a New York church contributed \$2500 toward the original construction.

Men of the community donated weeks of work.

Hot lunches were served by the women.

The church was consecrated April 26, 1931 by Bishop William P. Remington. Rev. Robert Greene of St. Pauls Episcopal Church comes out the third Sunday of every month for Holy Communion at 7:30 p.m.

The ladies Guild was organized about the same time as St. Barnabas church. The ladies have an annual bazaar and turkey dinner to assist with supporting the church. The Guild meets the fourth Thursday of every month.

Wm. D. Milne has been the lay vicar for the past ten years, under the direction of the Rt. Rev. Lane W. Barton, Bishop of the Missionary District of Eastern Oregon.
