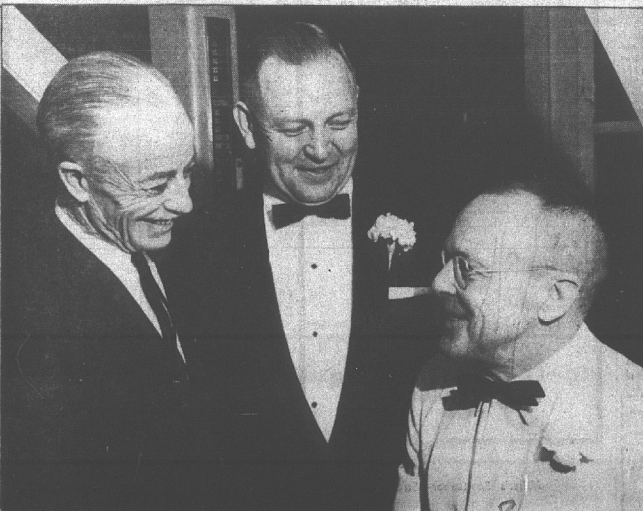
A handsome barometer was the club's gift to the outgoing commodore, Dick Bowers, who is shown above, right, receiving it from his successor, Matt Christian.
