Huskies Defeated By Bruins

SEATTLE (UPI)—The UCLA Bruins, with all five starters scoring in double figures, defeated the Washington Huskies 83-75 Friday night in a highly charged Pacific Athletic Conference basketball game. The Washington attack was led by Steve Olson with 17 and Lynn Nance with 15. Other Bruin scorers showed 11th Erickson with 17 and Edgar Lacey with 14. Goodrich scored 19 of his points in the second half. The victory kept the Bruin conference record perfect, 7-0, and gave them a 17-2 record for the season. It was Washington's fourth loss in the conference against three victories. UCLA's intermittent press and its frequency at the free throw line proved the difference in the ball game. UCLA got at least 14 points on steals of the ball on Washington's offense. The game was tied 34-all at the intermission.

Long Shots Paving Way At Phoenix

(UPI)—A trio of long shots led the parade into the third round of the \$87,500 Phoenix Open golf tournament Saturday, but some of the hottest men on the tour were only a putt or two away. The third round didn't get underway until 11 a.m. (MST), allowing some of Friday night's stragglers to finish — and the greens to thaw out. The leaders are Bert Vanoy, Al Geiberger, and Frank Beard, each with 137 totals. Closing in for the stretch run are defending champion Jack Nicklaus, Rod Patten, third round leader in the Bob Hope Desert Classic, and Claude King, who had a beautifully capped five-under par 31 for nine holes Friday. They each have 139 totals. The other big names were still in the fight, but just barely. Bill Casper, who captured the crown at Palm Springs last week and has won \$27,000 this year, is at 140; so is British Open champion Tony Lema. Closest to the leaders were Don January, Gay Brewer and Lionel Hebert, at 140.
