# Kennedy Film Problem For House Republicans

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Republicans on the House Foreign Affairs Committee today faced the sensitive problem of opposing—on principle—the commercial distribution of a government-made film on the late John F. Kennedy.

The committee was scheduled to act on a resolution, sponsored by Rep. Clement J. Zablocki, D-Wis., which would permit commercial showing in the United States of the highly praised film, "John F. Kennedy—Years of Lightning, Day of Drums."

Several years ago Congress directed the USIA not to show its films in the United States. It wanted to avoid the danger of an administration using a propaganda agency for domestic political purposes.

It is the major break from this policy which bothered Republicans on the foreign affairs committee.

Rep. Peter H.B. Frelinghuysen Jr., R-N.J., who saw the film, recognized that the subject could be an emotional one. But he insisted that the underlying policy was a good one and he did not think that it should be breached, even in this case.

# Supreme Court Justice Survives Nine Hours On Snowbound Mountain

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M. (UPI)—Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas stepped down from a shaggy rescue pony Monday night exhausted and bruised from nine snowbound hours on an icy mountain trail.

But looking back at the 10,000-foot Sandia Mountain peak he called the experience part of a "beautiful trip" and promised he would tackle it again some day.

Drifts Block Douglas, 67, rode the snow-topped mountain pony out of the mountains where he and three companions were stopped in their day's hiking by the treacherous switchback trail and heavy snowdrifts from an earlier blizzard.

After the hazardous six-mile return trip, the high court's famed outdoorsman admitted "I've never been in such a steep place." But aside from a minor gash on the right hip, he suffered no ill effects from his assault on the Sandia's Mountains western slope.

Painting a bit, Douglas told waiting newsmen in the Juan Tabo base camp that the atmosphere in the high altitude of the 10,000-foot mountain was tiring and had slowed him down.

Douglas, dressed in an old army work coat, heavy boots and wool sport shirt, said the trip would not hold up his scheduled appearance at Las Vegas Wednesday.
