

Michigan Prevails For Third Straight Week In First Spot

NEW YORK (UPI) — Michigan prevailed for the third straight week over UCLA and St. Joseph's (Pa.) in a three-team battle for first-place points in the weekly United Press International major college basketball ratings.

The Tennessee Volunteers entered the top 10 for the first time in the 15-year history of the ratings in 10th place following their victory over Vanderbilt Saturday. Duke and Wichita also made gains.

Michigan picked up four more first-place votes to increase its total to 25. Second-ranked UCLA lost four votes but remained only 27 points behind the Wolverines. Third-ranked St. Joseph's added 24 points and two first-place votes to climb within three points of second.

Providence, No. 4 for the third week in a row, was awarded the other first-place ballot from the panel of 35 coaches on the UPI ratings board. The Priors are the only unbeaten major team in the nation.

Duke jumped from seventh to eighth.

West Coast Teams Hold Rankings

The West Coast's two best basketball teams held their positions in this week's United Press International ratings, while the red-hot Western Athletic Conference quieted after getting some attention, too.

The UCLA Bruins remained in second position on the basis of their 15-2 record, while USC is in 12th again with a 17-3 record. Western Athletic Conference leader New Mexico (18-2) moved to 13th; second-place Brigham Young (16-4) is in 15th; and third-place Oregon (15-3) is tied for 19th place.

Meanwhile, Seattle continued rolling along toward an NCAA tournament berth by nipping Oklahoma City, 85-82, Monday night for its 10th consecutive win. That made the Cougars' record 17-4, while the losers are 1-9.

Charlie Williams pumped 20 for Seattle and Tom Wynn 20 for St. Louis. Now that the Chiefs' flashy crew of sophomores have become accustomed to the pressure of varsity competition, Seattle has emerged with what is probably the Pacific Coast's third best team.

The California Aggies made their record 11-7 with an 87-70 romp over Cal Baptist in the opening season in 15 years.

Another mighty mite, Nevada Southern, took a 57-53 squeaker from St. Joseph's of Albuquerque, N.M. Roosevelt Lee hit 21 for the winners, now 18-5. The losers are 16-6 on the campaign.

Hawaii continued getting colored on its tour by nipping mainland with an 89-75 victory. Tom Moreland hit 25 for the Vandals.

Santa Clara (5-2) takes on San Jose State (3-4) in West Coast Athletic Conference action tonight. Nevada meanwhile can move into a tie with the Cal Aggies in the Far West Conference with a win tonight at Sacramento State. Cal Poly of Pomona, one of the coast's best independents, tangles with San Fernando, which is tied for the lead of the California Collegiate Athletic Association with Fresno State.
