'Unspectacular' Gets 20 Points, 20 Rebounds

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — "Ollie Johnson isn't the spectacular type, but when you look after a while you find he has scored 20 points and gotten 20 rebounds."

Thus did coach Pete Peletta of the University of San Francisco acknowledge the anointment Monday that his 6-foot, 8-inch center had been named co-player of the week by the Northern California basketball writers and broadcasters. Sharing the honors was Mike Henderson, California's 6-foot pivotman, who played a key role in the Bears' weekend sweep of Oregon and Oregon State.

While Johnson was averaging 22 points per game in USF's weekend wins over Pepperdine and Loyola, Henderson accounted for a total of 42 points for two nights and held the opposing centers to one field goal over-all.

Center Assignment Still Doubtful For Warriors

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — It is hard to say just who will be at center tonight when the San Francisco Warriors host the Detroit Pistons in National Basketball Association action. Nate Thurmond is still playing with a sore back and coach Al Hannum says "I'm not going to take any more chances with Nate. If his back is bothering him at all, I won't play him against the Pistons."

Commodore Dierking is the only reserve center behind Thurmond and he's expected to be on hand tonight. But his father-in-law died in Cincinnati Saturday and Dierking flew there during the weekend.

It also now appears likely that Lee Shaffer, one of the key men in the Chamberlain trade, won't join the Warriors this season at all. Shaffer, who quit the Philadelphia 76ers in a contract dispute last summer, has been trying to wind up his business affairs in North Carolina to join the Warriors. But he has been unable to do so, and it now seems likely he won't join the team until next year.
