Shot Fells 2 Negroes In Mobile Race Fracas

Two Negro youths were felled by a shotgun blast from a moving automobile Tuesday night. They were standing in front of an ice cream parlor in a racially attacked neighborhood in Mobile, Ala.

Both were hospitalized early today in serious condition. Negro witnesses said the car contained two white men, dressed in business suits. They said one man, apparently the driver, was holding a shotgun, and the other was in the back seat of the car.

There had been no previous racial trouble at the ice cream parlor, described as a popular hangout for Negro teenagers, nor had there been any recent racial activity in the Gulf port city.

Negro leaders at Selma, Ala., held an early-morning strategy meeting today to decide on new tactics for a voter registration drive in rural Alabama. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. has vowed to carry his civil rights campaign into "every black belt county in the state of Alabama."

The strategy meeting followed an altercation on the Dallas County Courthouse steps in Selma Tuesday in which Sheriff Jim Clark and his deputies used clubs to prod Negroes off the steps and a top King aide was jailed with a split lip. Clark said he was uncertain if he struck the Rev. C.T. Vivian with his fists during the confrontation.

Elsewhere:
Jackson, Miss.: Federal officials and Negro leaders vowed to testify today at a U.S. Civil Rights Commission hearing into accusations of discrimination against prospective Negro voters in Mississippi. Gov. Paul Johnson told the commission Tuesday he would not permit lawlessness in the state.

Mobile, Ala.: Police arrested almost 200 Negro students Tuesday during a march on the courthouse to protest alleged "deplorable" conditions at a Negro high school. The students were charged with unlawful assembly.

Savannah, Ga.: Attorneys for Negro comedian Dick Gregory Tuesday filed a suit in federal court seeking to stop alleged discrimination at a drive-in restaurant which refused to serve Gregory and several other Negroes last week.

State Notes High Rate Of Measles

Twenty-six cases of German measles were reported in Klamath County during the week ending Feb. 6, as that disease led all other communicable diseases noted throughout the state during the same period, according to a survey by the Oregon State Board of Health.

The report shows 384 cases of the disease reported, with Tillamook leading all other counties with 71. Next came Multnomah (not including Portland), 51; Marion, 42; Clackamas, 36; and Josephine and Klamath, 26 each.

Other figures for the state indicated that the next most frequent disease was influenza, with 353 cases, followed by measles, 313; pneumonia, 33; scarlet fever, 27; and others in lesser numbers.

The breakdown of communicable diseases in Klamath and adjacent counties follows:
Klamath, 25; German measles, 12; influenza, nine; Diphtheria, 25; Pneumonia, nine; influenza, eight; German measles, seven; scarlet fever, one.
Douglas, six; Pneumonia, one; influenza, five.
Jackson, 25; Influenza, five; German measles, 26.
Josephine, 18; Influenza and German measles, seven each; measles, four.
Lake, six; Influenza, six.

France Seeks U.S. Nod On Plan For Indonesia

PARIS (UPI)—France moved today to persuade the United States to accept its plan for the neutralization of Indochina in negotiations with Communist China.

Foreign Minister Maurice Couve de Murville planned to leave for a three day visit to Washington immediately after receiving last-minute instructions from President Charles de Gaulle at a cabinet meeting.

Diplomatic sources said Couve de Murville will urge American officials to accept De Gaulle's viewpoint that no military solution to the crisis in Viet Nam is possible, and that the big powers must agree to disengage themselves from the conflict.

Premier George Pompidou returned from visits to India and Pakistan Thursday, saying he was more convinced than ever that no major Asian problems can be solved without the participation of Red China in negotiations.

Since France has an embassy in Peking and Red China maintains a large embassy in Paris, it was presumed that Couve de Murville would be able to convey to Washington officials the viewpoint of the Chinese Communists following the recent visit to Peking of Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin.

County Health Unit Offers 'Shots' For Klamath High School Students

Immunizations against polio and diphtheria - tetanus will be available to students at Klamath Union High School Tuesday and Wednesday in the cafeteria of the school, the Klamath County Health Department made known today.

Booster shots against polio myelitis are to be given Tuesday during the hours of 1:30 p.m. to 3 p.m. for freshmen and from 7:30 a.m. to 9 a.m. for all other students. The following day will be observed for the DT boosters.

Dr. Seth Kerron, county health officer, expressed his disappointment that only 400 students have indicated a desire to receive the polio immunizations while 365 had requested the DT boosters.

"These boosters, or immunizations, are advocated by the American Medical Association, American Public Health Association and the Oregon State Medical Society.

"Young people should keep up their immunization level not only in high school but through college and young adult life. This is true not only for polio and diphtheria - tetanus but also for smallpox and other diseases," Dr. Kerron said.

High Level Necessary
He continued: "While we haven't had any polio or diphtheria for some time, we must keep our immunization level up in order to keep this good record. With our great travel, communicable disease may be brought to us at this time," he said.
