Tucson Open Under Way Thursday

TUCSON, Ariz. (UPI)—A new golf course and \$16,000 more in prize money await the 164 pros who will tee off Thursday in the \$46,000 Tucson Open.

Five former winners are entered against a respectable field which includes Rod Funseth of Spokane, Wash., and Bert Yancey of Philadelphia. Funseth overtook Yancey in the final round of the \$67,000 Phoenix Open last weekend to win \$10,500, which was \$120 below his entire 1964 earnings.

Back to defend his Tucson Open title is Jacky Cupt. Other winners again competing are Phil Rodgers, Gene Litter, Lionel Hebert and Don January.

Opening round of the 72-hole event will be played Thursday at the 7,200-yard Tucson National Golf Club for the first time. Officials of the Professional Golfers' Association called the course "one of the finest desert courses ever constructed."

"Without winds," predicts host golf club pro Bob Kiewin, "the winning score will be around 275 or 277. If we get just two days of wind, the winning score will be 280 to 282." Par for the course is 72 or 280 for 72 holes.
