The recruitment schedule for next week includes, on Monday, Russell Avery of Avery, Fowler & Consultants, Inc., Red Bluff, who will interview specially selected survey technology students. On Monday and Tuesday, Burton McQueen, manager of Consumer Engineer Service Personnel with Olivetti-Underwood Corporation in New York, will interview students in the office machines, electronics and mechanical technologies. Also on Tuesday, Charles Luebert, personnel director for Freightliner Corp. at Portland, will interview mechanical, drafting and diesel technology students. On Thursday, Herb Runkle, liaison engineer with Winema National Forest, will again be on campus, and on Friday, W. F. Boyle, contracting engineer for the Western Contracting Co. in a party, Shou City, Iowa, will interview students from the diesel and surveying technologies.

Dr. Purvine appointed Bruno Marchese to represent Oregon Technical Institute on the Interinstitutional Committee on Archives. A letter from Chancellor R. E. Lieslauer informed Marchese of the appointment, which begins immediately.

Dr. Thompson, a University of Oregon economics professor, will lecture at a convocation program in the gymnasium next Tuesday morning from 9:40 to 10:30. Dr. Thompson, a professor of Marketing, will speak on the subject, "The Environment for Technically Trained Persons in Modern Industry." The assembly speaker is being sponsored by the Alpha Chapter of Student Engineering Technicians who have extended an invitation to the public to hear the lecture.

Dr. Purvine granted approval to two organizations to hold their state-wide conferences on the Oregon Tech campus this summer. Approximately 400 Garden Club members from the state of Oregon will hold a 4-day conference beginning June 13. Around 1,200 Job's Daughters will convene their three-day conference on June 17. Both groups will use the Residence Hall, Commons and the Physical Education building.

Russell Madison, Franell Spencer and Earl Buck of Oregon Tech's automotive faculty attended a meeting of the Society of Automotive Engineers in Portland Thursday night to hear a program on "The Instantor Brake System," which is a revolutionary development in hydraulic brake systems. It efforts such as these on the part of instructors which make possible to keep students informed of the latest developments in industry.

A seminar for auto-diesel students was conducted Tuesday on campus by Ernie Thompson, district sales manager for Colvax Motors, with Roy Peterson from the Zoller Piston Company and Ron Schelling from the Mammuth Engineering Company, both from Portland, participating in the program. Arrangements were made by Glenn Routs from Colvax's and Ben Morrison from the Oregon Tech staff.

Administrative Dean Jack Douglas has submitted Oregon Tech's request for funds from the Work Study Program of the Economic Opportunity Act. The funds are intended to stimulate and promote part-time employment in institutions of higher education for students who are from low-income families and who are in need of earnings from employment to pursue their education. "The positions are necessary to insure effective operation of the institution," Douglas said, "and would otherwise be required at the expense of available state funds."

Dean of Students Jack Churchill spent Feb. 12 at Corvallis with representatives of all State System institutions planning details of operating the Work Study Program on the various campuses. The offices responsible for placement service and financial aids at each institution will administer the program.

**Youth Faces Life In Prison**

EAGLE, Colo. (UPI)—A 17-year-old boy, charged with killing his younger brother last June, was convicted of the murder and sentenced to life in prison.

A 12-member district court jury returned the finding against Steven Ferrin of Basalt and set the penalty.

Officials charged the boy with shooting his 13-year-old brother, David, twice with a rifle last June 18 on a dirt road near their home.

The boys were the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Curtis Ferrin. The couple live on a farm near Basalt. No reason was given for the slaying.

# McNamara Taps China As Adversary Of U.S.

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara, in a global policy review, pinpoints Red China as the United States' chief adversary at the present time.

But he said that China's military capability is still "severely handicapped" by lack of Soviet aid and that, unless Russia changes her policy, it is "doubtful" Red China would "deliberately initiate any major overt aggression."

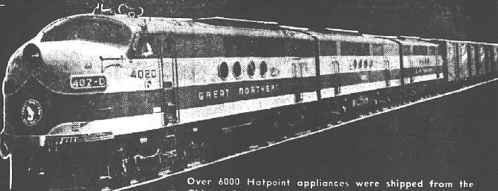
In a 207-page annual report submitted to the House Armed Services Committee Thursday, a document which delved deeply into world politics as well as military affairs, McNamara expressed cautious hope of continued improved relations with Russia.

But he pinpointed Communist China as a country whose "implacable animosity" and militant revolutionary doctrine confronts the United States at many points in Asia and, to a lesser extent, in Africa.

McNamara said the Vietnamese war is as "a decisive test" of what he described as Red China's theory that "any effort on the part of the Sino-Communist government of these throughout the continent an emerging nation can be met."
