Sticky Problem ...

Counterfeiters, Collectors Spell Trouble For Trading Stamp Firms

NEW YORK (UPI) — The trading stamp firms have a sticky problem of getting rid of the bulging books of stamps after they've been redeemed for cash in at least one state, Wisconsin, where the philatelist must take cash for his stamps and in all of the other states where trading stamps are legal (in Kansas they are banned by state law) they are theoretically redeemable for cash—even though the stamp collector might have to write to the company's home office to collect.

Trading stamp philately, a booming near-billion dollar industry, has had many troubles of its own to lick: —A trading stamp company in Detroit went bankrupt several years ago when its stamps were not destroyed and were redeemed twice. —In 1963, the Sperry & Hutchinson Co., the nation's oldest and largest trading stamp company, went to the New York State Supreme Court to stop a Utica, N.Y., stamp swapper whose "national stamp bank" was trading, buying and selling S&H green stamps. —And some fancy trading stamps, in a post office problem, even carried Yaleite letters through the mail. In Newark, N.J. last season, some stamps got by the post office's mechanized canceling machine.

Ever since the day Messrs. Sperry and Hutchinson first got the idea for green stamps back in 1936, unscrupulous gent's have been trying to cash in. In 1964, for example, the philatelist must take cash for his stamps and in all of the other states where trading stamps are legal (in Kansas they are banned by state law) they are theoretically redeemable for cash—even though the stamp collector might have to write to the company's home office to collect.

At its Los Angeles distribution center, the company had to stop this method of disposing of the books when the city said it contributed to the smog problem. Now, the stamp books go through a machine that turns them into pulp.

Most booklets of stamps are destroyed right in the redemption center. At the Metuchen, N.J. warehouse of S&H, a giant incinerator is used to burn some \$300,000 worth of the stamps in 100,000 books each work day.

Trading stamps have been stolen from stores and supermarkets by the thousands and today all of the 20 to 50 major trading stamp companies (there are about 100 of them all together—have top notch security staffs. They don't like to talk about it, but one of their problems is counterfeiting. Police have to uncover counterfeit rings dealing exclusively in trading stamps and an official of one stamp printing company says it now looking into complaints by at least three large companies that its stamps have been counterfeited.

High-Grade Paper To make it tough for would-be counterfeiters, most of whom place the bogus stamps on small gas stations and warty store owners, the trading stamp companies use high-grade safety paper that's most impossible to duplicate. They also put serial numbers on the stamps.
