SALEM (UPI)—The following measures were approved Wednesday by the Senate:

SB 140 — Increases to \$200 value of accounts in which costs allowed plaintiff.

SB 151 — Allows service of summons on district attorney by mail in divorce proceedings.

SB 173 — Expands District Court jurisdiction to cases of up to \$3,000 in value.

SB 184 — Exempts pickup trucks with campers from having to be licensed as trucks.

SB 210 — Allows court referees to be assigned in suits in equity.

HB 2017 — \$49,422 State Board of Census Budget.

HB 2025 — \$69,371 State Soil and Water Conservation Committee Budget.

HB 2028 — \$10,872 Board of Chiropractic Examiners Budget.

HB 2083 — \$87,474 Board of Cosmetic Therapy Examiners Budget.

HB 2084 — \$72,105 Board of Dental Examiners Budget.

HB 2089 — \$108,401, Board of Nursing Budget.

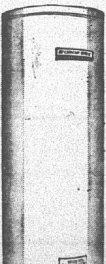

Control System Cuts Damage Toll During December Floods

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Army Engineers said Wednesday that still uncompleted flood control systems prevented between \$726 million and \$1 billion in damages along the Northern Pacific coast last December.

"Some projects paid for themselves in this one flood," said the engineers, "... though nowhere in the region were authorized flood-control systems complete."

The damage that was prevented, the engineers said in a statement, "may well establish a new U.S. record."

Most of the damage, the report said, occurred in areas where there was partial or no flood protection.

"More than \$100 million took place in the valleys of Northern California coastal streams, and another \$80 million on the Rogue and Umpqua rivers in Oregon, where there are no major flood control projects," the engineers said.

In contrast, said the report, "in California's Sacramento valley only a few miles away, the

Sacramento river levee and by-pass system prevented damage exceeding \$150 million for the fourth time in less than 10 years, and Shasta and Folsom reservoirs saved almost \$100 million more."

The report said that only seven of an authorized 14 flood-control reservoirs had been completed in Oregon's Willamette Basin, but they were credited

with saving about \$500 million in damages.

The severe damage suffered by Portland, Ore., the engineers said, "was nothing compared to that which would have occurred without the flood control reservoirs on the Willamette and Columbia rivers."

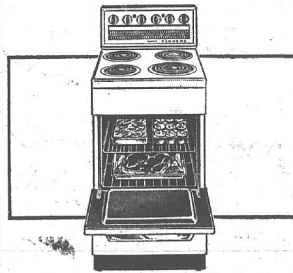

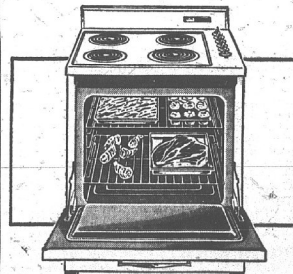

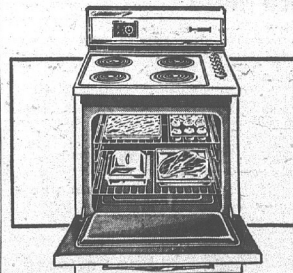
