The dinner will be held on Sunday, Feb. 28, at 6:30 p.m., in the Main Community Hall. There is no charge for the dinner. Hostess for the fellowship is Mrs. John Banta with Mrs. Iven Graham in charge of the arrangements.

A three-week canvass of the membership has begun to raise funds for the new building which will cost \$46,000. The school plant will replace the present structure which has been in use since 1941. It is hoped that construction can begin in the spring of 1966. Elder Stanley Miles, Klamath Falls Seventh-day Adventist Church pastor, stated that the new church school will be a two-room building and that he anticipates an increase in the number of students from the present 20 to possibly 30 or 35 due to the new building.

Four weeks of things to do and sights to see in San Francisco, the eventful city.

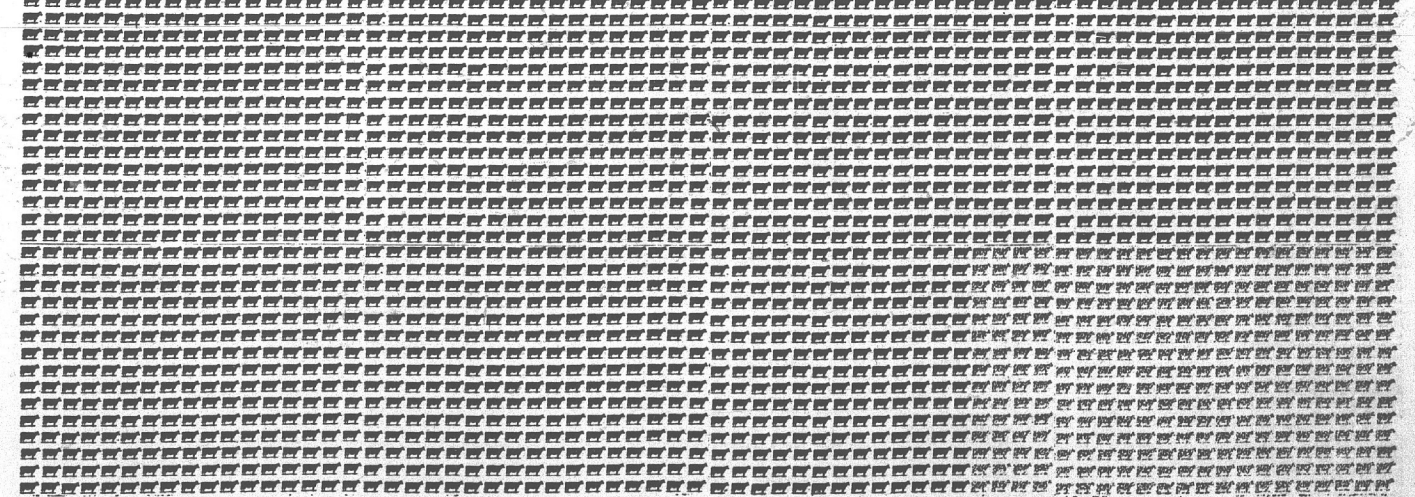
