### Some QUICK Facts ABOUT KLAMATH COUNTY OREGON

Klamath Falls is the home of Oregon Technical Institute, internationally recognized as one of the finest technical institutes in the U.S.

Crater Lake — Oregon's only National Park — one of the world's natural wonders — lies wholly within Klamath County.

On the main Pacific Flyway, the Klamath Basin is a principal stop-over for some 4 million ducks and geese each year.

Klamath Falls is headquarters for the Winema National Forest, one of four National Forests in the county.

More than 10,000 carloads of Klamath netted gem potatoes — none finer in the world — are shipped annually from the Klamath Basin.

Annual precipitation in Klamath Falls is 13.06 inches — just slightly more than that of Tucson, Arizona!

Klamath County is the center of one of the largest stands of Ponderosa pine trees in the world.

Klamath Falls' Municipal Airport — home of the 408th Fighter Group, USAF — is open for flying 96.7% of the time.

Over 100 mountain lakes, plus 80 streams and rivers in Klamath County offer the country's greatest trout fishing.

You can water ski for 30 miles in a straight line on Upper Klamath Lake — Oregon's largest body of fresh water.

The elevation of Klamath Falls is 4105', with Mt. Thielsen the highest point in the county at 9,182'.

Klamath County is one of Oregon's top livestock producers.

Within 125 miles of Klamath Falls, there are five of the Northwest's best known ski areas.

There are 275 days of sunshine annually in Klamath Falls, Oregon's City of Sunshine.

Klamath Falls' metropolitan area population — within 5 miles of downtown — is 35,000.
