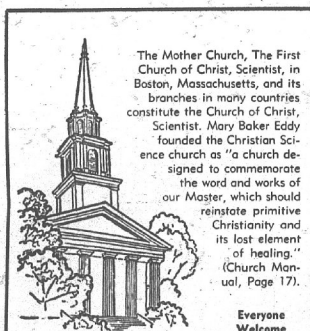

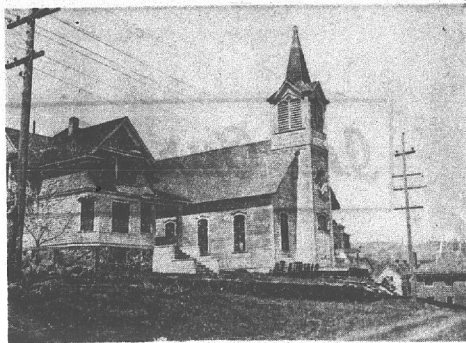

History Of Catholicism Traced In Klamath Country

The earliest known Catholic to settle here was a single man named Jack Furbur, followed closely by the Brotherton, Body, Colwell and Callahan families, settling near the present town of Merrill.

Only the women of the Brotherton and Body families survived the attacks of Modoc Indians during the Modoc War as Hook Jim, escaping from encounters with soldiers on Lost River, Nov. 29, 1872, rampaged through the Merrill area killing settlers as he went.

At the time, the Klamath country was still a part of Jackson County which encompassed the southwestern part of Oregon. Shortly after the

massacre of these Catholic families, Lake County was formed in 1874 with the county seat in Linkville (later in Lakeview).

It was during this period that Klamath County, along with present day Jackson and Lake County, was included in one parish of the Catholic Church in the Archdiocese of Oregon City.

With only a few priests to administer to the entire Catholic community by horseback, long periods of time passed before a priest journeyed into the vicinity to perform marriages, baptisms and read mass. Masses generally were celebrated in a ranch house. The first priest to serve here was Father Blanche

residing in Jacksonville, visiting once in three or four years.

In 1882, the county of Klamath was formed with Linkville as the county seat. The first baby to be born in the new county was also the first Catholic child, John Colwell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dan Colwell. It was at the Colwell home that the mass was most frequently said due to the convenience of the Catholic settlers. The first communion class oddly enough was formed by the three Colwell children some years later. A new priest came to the area in the early '90s, Father E. P. Murphy from Ashland. Again due to the great distance he had to cover, visitations were few and far between.

Baker Diocese Formed
As time passed the territory became more settled and the population was growing by leaps and bounds. On Feb. 7, 1898, Linkville officially became Klamath Falls. Because of the population swell, in 1903, this district along with eastern Oregon became detached from the archdiocese and formed part of the newly created Diocese of Baker City with Father Charles Joseph O'Reilly appointed as bishop to head the diocese.

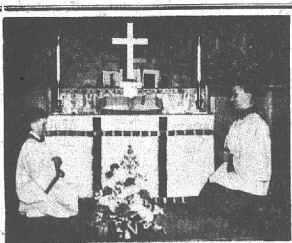
In records taken from the Klamath Catholic Monthly, it is stated that Bishop O'Reilly first visited Klamath County in

1903, coming by horseback by way of Pokigama. He lectured this visit in the good bishop's O'Reilly on Jan. 4, 1892, in St. Mary's and it leads the reader to believe that perhaps the 1903 was a typographical error since the bishop does mention a similar visit in 1901. During his 1904 visit, not only did he lecture in both Klamath Falls and Merrill, but he also secured a block of land in both towns in Oct. 11.

At this point it is necessary in the telling of the history of the Catholic Church here, to include a bit about the type of man Bishop O'Reilly

was born Charles Joseph O'Reilly on Jan. 4, 1862, in St. John, New Brunswick, Canada. At an early age, he was sent to the school of the Christian Brothers of the De la Salle foundation to further his Christian education and finally on to St. Joseph's University, earning his Master of Arts degree where upon he entered the teaching profession at St. Michael's College as principal in the fall of 1887, later known as the Catholic Church here, in 1887 he also included a bit about the type of man Bishop O'Reilly

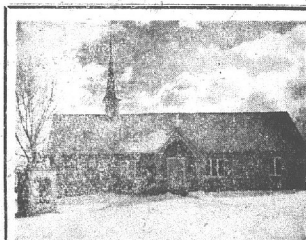
