The Klamath Union High School District Budget Committee Thursday night approved a 1965-66 budget calling for a cut in general fund taxes, but an overall levy rise due to the repayment of a \$1.2 million bond issue.

Salaries Up
The approved 1965-66 budget calls for total expenditures of \$1,680,982. General fund expenditures of \$1,327,157 are principally due to salary increases and inclusion of maintenance items set out in the 1964-65 budget.
