

Five Parishes Now Exist

Father Geis returned to the area in September, 1955, to take charge of the newly formed district in Chiloquin which comprised the northern portion of Sacred Heart Parish and the Klamath Indian Territory. A block of land was purchased in 1956 with a newly built church dedicated to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel on Sept. 8 of that year. On Feb. 13, 1958, the Chiloquin Mission was canonically erected as a parish.

In 1958 Merrill was established as a separate parish from Sacred Heart, entitled Holy Cross with the first pastor being Father James M. O'Connor celebrating his first mass there on Sept. 4, 1958. Due to the lack of a rectory and the difficulty in renting a home, Father O'Connor remained in residence at Sacred Heart until February, 1959, when a new church was begun and finally dedicated on Sept. 28, 1959, with a parish being completed the following year. The new church and parish was then designated as St. Augustine's.

The history of these parishes has not always been smooth as the reader will note, but they have always been under very capable and wise leadership beginning with the good Bishop O'Reilly, making the rough times seem not so bad.

Since the beginning of Catholicism in the territory, steeply changing changes have taken place from humble make-do places of worship to the formation of three parishes. Rapid growth in the Catholic population necessitated the splitting of the St. Augustine Parish in 1946 to form a new one in Tulelake, Holy Cross Parish, and the splitting of the Sacred Heart Parish in 1957 to form the St. Pius X Parish.

The development of these par-

Six Ministers Accept Posts Here In 1964

During 1964 six new ministers and one protentore p a s t o r came to churches of the Klamath Basin, filling some pastoral positions long vacant.

The Immanuel Baptist Church pastorate, which had been vacated in September, 1963, was filled by Rev. Marvin V. Turner in February of last year. Rev. Turner's ministry has included 25 years, all of which was spent in service in a church in Michigan and one in Ohio.

Arriving in July to replace Rev. Quinn Hawley at the Congregational Church (United Church of Christ) was Rev. Frank Maddox Winn. He was ordained into the Christian ministry as a pastor of the Congregational Church on Sept. 10.

Rev. Daniel Swartz succeeded Rev. Ernest Franklin as the minister of the Free Methodist Church, completing his first Sunday worship service on Aug. 15. Rev. Swartz has served the Free Methodist ministry for more than 40 years as an evangelist and pastor.

August marked the arrival of Rev. Royce A. Collier, D. D., to the Faith Tabernacle Temple. He was previously engaged in evangelistic work in the east and western states. Rev. Jesse Barnett, an Oregon native, was appointed as interim pastor at the Church of The Brethren by the district secretary of the church organization during the later part of November, 1964. Rev. 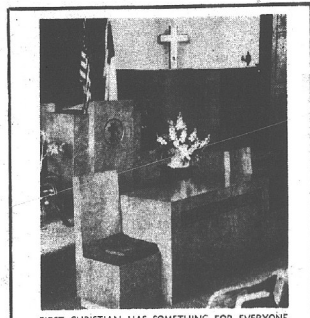
