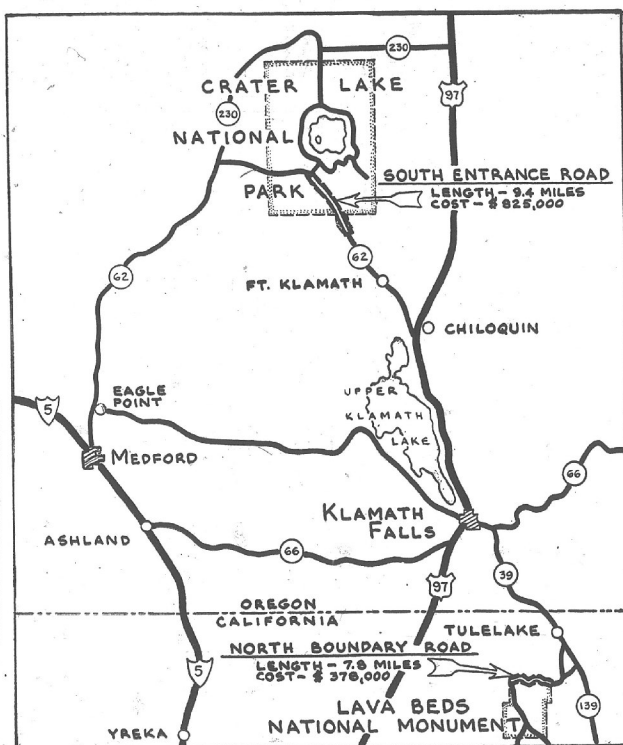




Crater Lake Community School Completed

PENSION INCREASE

NEW YORK (UPI) — For every American worker who was covered by a private pension plan in 1950 there likely will be four workers covered by 1980, according to an Institute of Life Insurance report on projections by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The BLS study indicated much of the growth of private pension coverage so far has stemmed from labor union developments. However, near one-third of the workers in the BLS study were covered by plans not part of collective bargaining agreements.

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Many Improvements Made At Park In 1964

The year 1964 was a busy one for Crater Lake National Park, ready to be noted since the transfer was made, according to Superintendent Richard A. Nelson. The Mission 66 program, designed to update development and management of the National Parks and thereby enhance visitor enjoyment, reached a high level of activity locally with the near completion of improvements along the 9.4-mile South Entrance road, an \$825,000 project, and the construction of six quarters for personnel at a cost of \$147,000.

South Entrance road, one of the scenic routes in the park, is being reconstructed by the Acme Construction Company of Portland. This project, which includes straightening and repaving, construction of three picnic and parking areas, vista clearing, preparation of scenic overlooks, and seeding and planting, was begun in 1963. The work was resumed during the summer of 1964 and continued until Nov. 15, completing 98 per cent of the contract.

Three modern, two-story duplexes provide additional housing for the staff. These accommodations were necessitated by consolidation of the Medford office with park headquarters. Seven additional employees now reside in the park as a result of this move. Considerable improvement in efficiency of operation, including reduction in

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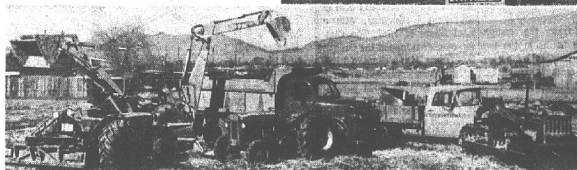

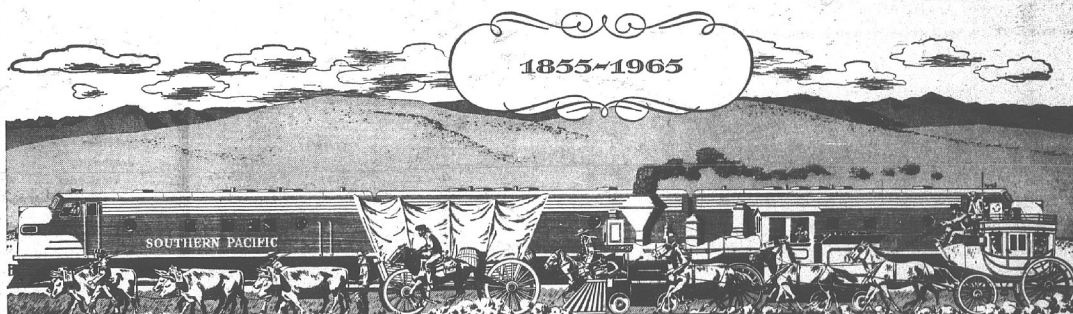
