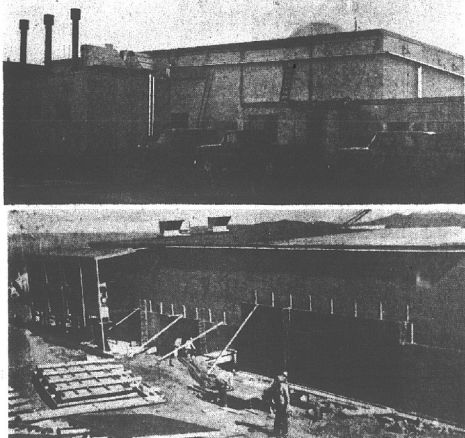
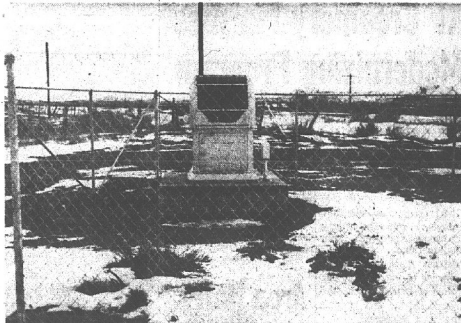
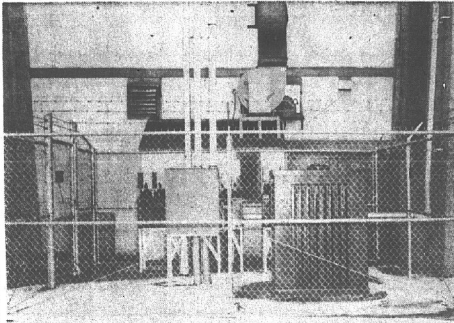

1964 Year Of Many Accomplishments By Kingsley Field Groups

KINGSLEY FIELD — The year 1964 was a year of many accomplishments for the 408th Fighter Group and its attached units. Some highlights of the year were:

In April the 408th Fighter Group was named top unit in the Air Defense Command in the U.S. Payroll Savings Bond Program. Both Lt. Gen. Herbert B. Thatcher, commander of ADC, and Maj. Gen. H. R. Spicer, commander of the 25th Air Division extended special words of appreciation to the 408th Fighter Group for its outstanding support of the Savings Bond program.

In July it was announced that Kingsley Field had turned in \$12,000 in validated savings to the Air Force Cost Reduction Program. This amount represented more than 400 per cent of Kingsley's assigned goal for fiscal year '64.

During September, the 322nd Fighter Interceptor Squadron flew 112 sorties in one day to

break the record of 101 established by the squadron in December, 1963. On Oct. 27, Kingsley Field personnel contributed 181 pints of blood to the Klamath County Red Cross Bloodmobile.

During 1964 Kingsley personnel contributed a total of 482 pints of blood to the Red Cross — 32 pints over its 450 pint quota.

In November, Kingsley Field contributed a total of \$10,000 to the Klamath County United Fund, or 140.2 per cent of its \$7,200 goal.

During the year several units won awards. The accounting section was recognized during the year as best in ADC for bases in Kingsley's category. In addition, the 408th Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, and the Support Squadron, adopted for an estimated total of \$5,000.

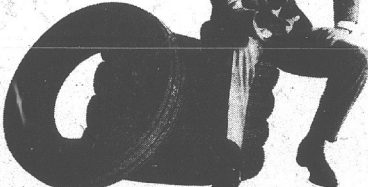
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
