Versatility — the ability to adapt to modern logging methods — has enabled Bly Logging Co. to continually progress during the past 13 years; 1964 was a great year for us, and we're proud of our success and of the achievements of the 125 men who make up the Bly Logging Crew and add over \$600,000 in payroll to the economy of the Klamath Basin! Just look at this record for 1964:

- New Shop Building — Constructed, a 60' x 122' modern heavy equipment repair shop on Highway 97 just south of Klamath Falls. This new building enables us to keep equipment repaired and working the year 'round.
- New Helicopter — In June, Bly Logging purchased the first privately owned helicopter in the Klamath Basin. This new copter enables us to evaluate timber tracts or scout roadways quickly and to rush parts or repairs to machinery on any job, anywhere, as well as providing ambulance service when needed by our employees.
- Pacific Logging Congress — Robert B. Kennedy, a partner in Bly Logging Co., became president of Pacific Logging Congress on January 1, 1965. It is the oldest and largest logger's association in the west and is annually attended by nearly 2,000 loggers from Alaska to Mexico. To be elected president of Pacific Logging Congress is one of the highest honors a logger can receive in his career.
- Road Construction — Bly Logging is one of the leading contractors in the construction of forest service specified roads. During 1964 the firm completed many miles of specified roads, plus over 100 miles of spur roads.
- Salvage — An outstanding example of Bly Logging's inventiveness and adaptability is the Westfall skidding tractor, which enables us to log less than 100 board feet per acre economically, thus saving thousands of dollars in logs each year.
