Ambassador Taylor To Report To Johnson

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (UPI)—U.S. Ambassador Maxwell D. Taylor left here Saturday night for Washington where he will report to President Johnson and other administration officials on the improved political stability in South Viet Nam.

He claimed there was no crisis in South Viet Nam and that there was no special purpose for his visit to Washington.

In a statement at Tan Son Nhut Airport before his departure for Washington, Taylor told newsmen: "I am really glad to see you this evening, but I really have nothing of importance to say to you. You already know the purpose of my visit: To resume the trips to Washington which have been more or less routine in the past."

Taylor said he will see four senior officials in Washington about the situation here in South Viet Nam. There is no crisis, there is no special purpose for this visit, but I find our officials in Washington find it most useful to have these periodic dialogues face to face on the matters which affect us.

The ambassador said he did not know how long he would be in Washington and added: "about a week, that's the normal practice in the past, but if it takes more or less three I will not say so."

Asked if he expected the question of the possibility of more American troops coming into South Viet Nam would be raised in his Washington talks, Taylor replied, "I don't want to speculate on the questions that will come up."

He said the discussions would be of a broad nature and added: "I wouldn't want to underline any particular part."

Authoritative American Embassy sources said Taylor is particularly pleased with the progress towards achieving political stability demonstrated by the government of Premier Phan Hys Guan. They said he will convey this view to both President Johnson and Secretary of State Dean Rusk.
