

# American Taxpayers Spending \$2 Million Per Day In S. Viet Nam

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (UPI) — The cost of the war in Viet Nam is going up. The military aid budget for Viet Nam in the coming fiscal year is \$2.2 billion, up from \$1.9 billion in the current year.

A seemingly minor item like a drop in the price of military aircraft from \$20 million to \$15 million in a single night, to rob the Viet Cong guerrillas of the cover of darkness as they wriggle up on outnumbered garrisons.

The most expensive defeat given more funds is the 10-look cluster bomb, designated Cluster Bomb Unit, the bomb disintegrates in the air, scattering small bomblets over an area up to 100 yards in diameter.

The bombs in turn explode in all directions, scattering thousands of razor-sharp little bombs. These are said to have been found extremely deadly for enemy troops, even in dense jungle.

The area bomb fits neatly under the wings of jet fighter-bombers. It is reported to have been used in attacks on Communist troop concentrations in both North and South Viet Nam.

The Pentagon responded with a "no comment" when asked about it. But Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara told Congress last month that "substantial procurements are now being made."

## U.S. Arsenal Changing For Viet War

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The anti-Communist war in South Viet Nam is changing the character of the U.S. weapons arsenal for "limited warfare," a survey shows.

Lethal devices which have been reported effective are getting the go-ahead for increased production. Others are being discarded. And new weapons are being devised to fill obvious gaps.

Chief among the weapons given more funds is the 10-look cluster bomb, designated Cluster Bomb Unit, the bomb disintegrates in the air, scattering small bomblets over an area up to 100 yards in diameter.

The bombs in turn explode in all directions, scattering thousands of razor-sharp little bombs. These are said to have been found extremely deadly for enemy troops, even in dense jungle.

The Barrs' repertoire includes a varied program of musical selections to suit most tastes, ranging from rare and original two-piano music by the greatest composers through transcriptions from the modern orchestra to intricate arrangements of popular show tunes.

During the years that a Barrs have been performing in concert tours, they have accumulated an amazing number of "rave reviews" for their appearances. Perhaps the warmest reception received from their audiences could be attributed to their unusual background.

## Gov. Romney Declares State Mourning For Murdered Woman

DETROIT (UPI) — Gov. George Romney Saturday officially proclaimed two days of state mourning Monday and Tuesday for a civil rights worker "who made the supreme sacrifice in the unending cause of securing for all of her fellow American citizens those inalienable rights endowed on each by our Creator."

The official proclamation came as a movement was under way to dramatize the services for and burial of Mrs. Viola Gregg Liuzzo, 39. She was shot to death on a lonely road near Selma, Ala., Thursday night while shuttling civil rights marchers between Montgomery and Selma.

In the proclamation, Romney said, "This shocking murder can stand for all as an ironic symbol for the need to battle on for the cause for which she died and to illumine the fact that her death was not in vain."

He proclaimed Monday and Tuesday as a period of mourning throughout the state and urged "every citizen to observe this period in his own way and to personally strive in thought, deed and action to fulfill the true goals of peace and brotherhood."

Mrs. Liuzzo's body was flown back to Michigan Friday night aboard a private plane owned by the Teamsters' Union. Her husband, Anthony, 51, is a business agent for Teamsters' Local 247.

The Teamsters, speaking for the Liuzzo family which was in seclusion in their Northwest Detroit home, said the body would be on view to the family and close friends Sunday and that burial Tuesday also would be private.


