

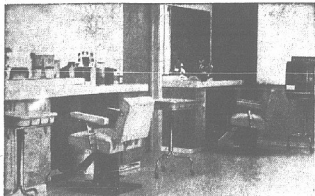

Norman Norell Predicts Spring Fashions

SAN FRANCISCO — Norman

Norell, one of the most prominent designers in the world, has shown his collection of spring and summer fashions for 1965.

The collection includes very short jersey kilts for the country. These are accompanied by jersey cardigans and jersey leotards.

Suits have either mildly straight skirts or quite full skirts. The jackets of the latter are short and fitted. All the above are high-waisted. Some have longer belted jackets — slightly like a man's "dressing gown." Several of the suits

shown have jackets which completely cover the skirt.

There are loose coats in this collection. Many of them are very narrow and high-waisted — quite like children's reeders. There also is a new version of last season's successful belted coat. A new coat is cut with an Inverness front.

For travel and country use, trousers with easy belted flares are both casual and comfortable.

Many of the day dresses are again high-waisted. In fact, this high-waisted look runs throughout the entire collection. It produces the "long-legged" look. Some of the dresses have the "dressing gown" mood. The newest afternoon dresses are cut like the Japanese kimono. (Perhaps this kimono idea is an inspiration from Jules Francois Crayon's collection. Crayon is one of the foremost designers in France.)

Large hats are worn with day dresses, suits and coats. For evening, the Japanese kimono, in printed and plain silks, either with full or slim skirts is again featured. Some full-skirted dresses are worn with equally full wrist length jackets. These costumes are made in both day-length and floor-length. As always, there are some long, slim, black evening dresses. All evening dresses have the high-waisted look.

Again, there are home pajamas with narrow trousers and tunics, done in printed and plain silks. In this collection you will find only two embroidered dresses — two short net evening dresses, embroidered with a new spangle, and the wedding dress embroidered in the same manner.

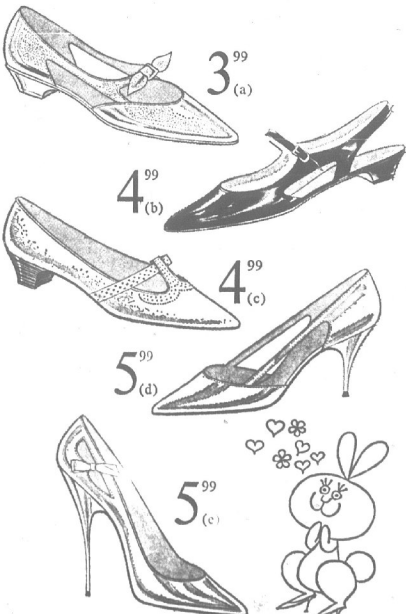
