

# 'Implied Consent' Bill Okayed By Committee

SALEM (UPI) — The controversial bill permitting chemical tests of the breath of suspected drunken drivers headed a long list of measures approved by legislative committees Tuesday.

The so-called "implied consent" measure was approved by the House Judiciary Committee for the second time this session. It was sent back for more amendments by the house March 16.

The bill now provides that a person suspected of driving while under the influence of alcohol to submit to a chemical analysis of his breath.

Refusal could lead to suspension of his driver's license for 90 days.

Judiciary Chairman John Delaney, R-Medford, said the amendments were designed to give the driver "a fair trial." The original bill included blood tests and did not provide for the present system of appeals to the Department of Motor Vehicles and a Circuit Court review of the suspension would take effect.

The vote to send the measure to the House for action was 74-47, with the committee's four Democrats opposing it.

Limit Removed

The Judiciary Committee also approved a bill removing the \$25,000 limit on wrongful death suits.

It approved in principle an amended bill under which driver whose license was suspended for six months for driving while under the influence of alcohol could get a temporary license if it was necessary in his job.

The decision would be up to the courts.

The house agriculture committee approved three bills of minor importance to various groups, including measures to revise the state's egg inspection and licensing law and another which would require riding stables to be licensed.

The third bill would require the most slaughtered under unsanitary conditions to be marked when placed in a commercial locker or any similar establishment.

The measure is a complete revision by Rep. Irvin Mann Jr., R-Stanford, of a bill which would have prevented hanging unlicensed meat from the same premises where inspected meat was sold commercially.

Owners of mobile slaughterhouses claimed the original measure was an effort by fixed establishments to drive them out of business.

Insurance Bill OK'd

# Steel Union Sets Sights On Aluminum

PITTSBURGH (UPI) — The United Steelworkers Union (USW), which has negotiated a satisfactory contract with the can industry, set its sights today on an equally successful agreement with aluminum producers.

The union has served notice on the aluminum industry it wants to bargain for a new contract replacing the present three-year agreement which expires June 1.

The USW represents 50,000 workers in the Aluminum Co. of America (ALCOA) plants, Reynolds Metals Co., Kaiser Aluminum Co., Olin Mathieson and Armet Aluminum Co.

Recently the union organized the Harvey Aluminum Co., and it has reported this firm would take part in collective contract negotiations.

Alcoa, the nation's leading producer, has been invited by the USW to offer "suggestions" on the time and place for the opening of negotiations.

The can industry has set a pattern in contract negotiations with the USW. In that industry, it has been the steel industry which was the peacemaker.

The nation's "big 11" basic steel producers are bargaining with the nation's third largest union in efforts to reach an agreement before the May 1 strike deadline.

Chief negotiators for both sides refused their joint talks today. No final estimate has been made of the union's demands, but sources said that on the issue of wages alone the union sought pay increases of at least 12.5 cents an hour in each of two years of a proposed three-year agreement. Some sources said the total of the economic concessions sought by the union could run as high as \$1 an hour.

# 'Tobacco' Senator Concedes Health Warning May Be Due

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. B. Everett Jordan, whose state of North Carolina is the nation's leading tobacco producer, conceded today that Congress probably will require some kind of health warning on cigarette packages.

But, in a statement submitted to a Senate committee considering such legislation, Jordan urged rejection of a move to require that a health warning be included on cigarette advertising.

"If such should be required," the North Carolina Democrat said, "then one of our major industries would, in effect, be required... to pay to tell the public... not to use its products."

The Senate Commerce Committee is considering two bills to require a health warning on cigarette packages. One of them, introduced by Sen. Maurice B. Neuberger, D-Ore., also would require the warnings in all cigarette advertising.

The committee, which is in recess today, expects to conclude its public hearings on the bills.
