

Crime Loss Measure Praised By Educator

SALEM (UPI)—A bill providing compensation for crime victims was described to a House subcommittee Tuesday as the forerunner of laws which will be passed by every state in the union.

The legislation was made by Dean Seward Reese of the Willamette University College of Law and other witnesses before a judicial subcommittee in favor of a bill introduced by Rep. Betty Roberts, D-Portland.

"We are in a society in which the loss is distributed broadly for nearly everything that happens to a person," Dr. Reese said. "In time all states will have this."

Mrs. Roberts' bill would apply only to victims of crimes of violence and would be limited to \$2,000 for pecuniary loss and \$1,000 for pain and suffering. The bill carries a \$100,000 appropriation.

Members of the subcommittee indicated an interest, although Chairman James Redden, D-Medford, held no hope the measure would pass the House this session.

Prices Hold Steady Rate

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Consumer prices held steady in February while the take-home pay and buying power of factory workers edged up to a record high, the Labor Department said Tuesday.

A department spokesman said however, that there probably has been a cost-of-living increase this month.

The Labor Department's Consumer Price Index (CPI) remained unchanged in February from January at 103.9 percent of average 1957-59 prices. This means that it cost \$103.99 last month to buy the same goods and services that were priced at \$100 about six years ago.

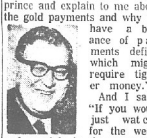
