Dodgers Reveal Plate Power In Spring Training Contests

Apparently the Los Angeles Dodgers are taking quick offense to those offensive statements about their lack of punch.

It's only spring training, but the Dodgers have been hitting with consistent authority — a characteristic even lacking in their world championship season two years ago.

The new-found attack along with their showcase pitching staff has inspired Las Vegas oddsmakers to pick the Dodgers 2-1 to win the National League flag this season — quite a feat for a team that finished a dismal sixth-place last year.

The Dodgers have scored five or more runs in 12 games this spring, and four times have scored nine or more. Their 13 home runs rank the Dodgers among the team leaders in the distance department.

Dismantle Cards

Wednesday, Los Angeles dismantled the world champion St. Louis Cardinals with a six-run second inning en route to a 7-3 victory. Tommy Davis and Wes Parker led the assault, driving in two runs apiece during the rally against 16-game winner Curt Simmons. Tommy and Willie Davis, along with Parker and rookie Jim Lefebvre, have been the leading hitters for Los Angeles this spring.

Winning pitcher Johnny Podres gave up two runs and four hits in the first inning, but avoided more trouble with a successful pickoff play and allowed only one other run in the five innings he worked.

The loss was costly to the Cards, who lost reliever Ron Taylor in the seventh inning when he suffered a possible torn ligament in his left elbow while driving into second base.

In other exhibition games, Philadelphia routed Cincinnati 10-1, Houston stopped the Chicago White Sox 4-1, Detroit whitewashed Milwaukee 4-2, the New York Yankees defeated Kansas City 6-3, Minnesota stopped Baltimore 5-1, San Francisco beat Boston 6-2, and Washington shut out the New York Mets 6-0.

Allen Hits Homer

Richie Allen hit a two-run homer and Tony Taylor contributed a triple good for two runs in the Phillies bombardment of pitcher Jim Maloney. Ray Culp and Jack Baldwin (run limited Cincinnati) to free hits, including Percen Johnson's solo homer.

Rusty Staub stroked a two-run homer over Joe Jordan while Houston pitchers Ken Johnson and 18-year-old Larry Dierker held the White Sox to three hits. Johnson struck 12 straight men before giving up a run in the sixth on singles by Alton Williams, Gene Stephens and Al Weis.

Denry McLain allowed only three hits over seven innings over a two-run homer by Felipe Alou of the Braves. Jim Northrup hit a pinch homer for the

Twins, yielding only the first six innings. Bert Campaneris had three singles for the A's and Elston Howard added a double and triple to the Yankee attack.

Knocks In Four

Harmon Killebrew drove in four runs with a homer — his first of the spring — and a single in the Twins victory. Jim Kaat worked eight innings for the Twins, yielding only one run on a home run by Brooks Robinson of the Orioles.

Ed Bailey drove in three runs with a homer and a single and Gaylord Perry allowed only three hits in seven innings for the Giants. Tony Conigliaro and Lee Thomas each had two hits for Boston.

Paul Ortega and Jim Duckworth combined for a three-hit effort against the Mets and Ken McMillan socked a home run for the Senators — their 20th round tripper in 18 games. Tom Parson, who shut out the Senators for five innings, allowed two runs on McMillan's homer in the sixth and was the loser.
