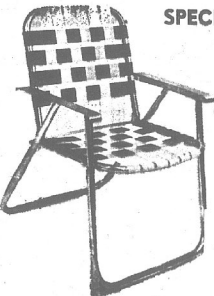

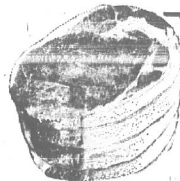
Although most grapes are still to be excellent buys, several oranges will probably be in good supply for a month or more. Grapefruit is available from Florida, Texas, California's Coachella Valley and Arizona. Prices vary considerably according to the quality of the fruit.
 Apples are starting to come from controlled storage and prices from now on will likely be slightly higher. Bananas are still reasonable in price, but will probably go up a bit within a couple of weeks as supplies decrease.
 Melons from far away places are available. Honey dew from South America and cantaloupe and watermelon from Mexico carry luxury prices. Quality is generally good.
 The first Oregon rhubarb is here. Prices are lower than for the hothouse rhubarb. Outdoor rhubarb is usually more tart so remember to use a little more sugar than with the hothouse variety.
 Many markets are bright with daffodils. These are a welcome, inexpensive flower for non-gardeners and apartment dwellers. There are plenty of greens available for tossed salads. All kinds of lettuce—head, leaf, butter and Romaine are wonderful quality and inexpensive for this time of year. Green onions and radishes are very good and still reasonable in price.
 Bunch beets are reasonable and may offer a double value. Often times the best greens are fresh enough to cook. They are very flavorful and are high in vitamins A and iron.
 Broccoli will likely be featured in a number of food ads at very reasonable prices. Cabbage is another good buy. Celery supplies are increasing and prices have dropped a bit. Cauliflower is a little more expensive because of cold weather in growing areas.
 Asparagus supplies are slowly increasing and prices are starting to drop. Red tinged garlic from Mexico, according to produce men, has lots of flavor and keeps better than our regular white garlic.
 Cucumbers, egg plant and peppers from Mexico are all rather expensive. Fresh peas are a new item found in some markets. Cream with new potatoes to add a welcome spring note to menus. Artichokes, which were plentiful last year, are increasing in price, are higher because of cold weather in the Castroville growing area, the artichoke center of the world.
 Old crop yearling lambs offer good value right now. These have nice meaty cuts. The new spring lamb won't be along for another month or so. Lamb steaks are economical and delicious when oven roasted without water in a covered pan. Use a low temperature 225 degrees, and season with a bit of garlic, salt, and pepper.
 Luncheon meats and smoked meats will probably be featured in many ads at bargain prices.
 Good weather is giving us plenty of fresh seafood for luncheon menus. Crab, smelt, red snapper and fllet of sole are plentiful. There are several varieties of sole from which to choose. One of the most delicious is the Petrale sole which has an excellent flavor and holds its shape well when cooked. Another sole, not so well known, which offers delicious eating is the small Rex sole. These little fish have a very delicate flavor.
 Canned salmon is very plentiful and we will see some good values—particularly on the pink salmon which is especially plentiful. Easy-to-use and easy-to-serve canned salmon is a real convenience food which is excellent for main dishes, sandwiches, salads, soups and chowders.
