## Girl Scouts Plan Sale Of Cookies

Unanimous approval was given the Juniper Girl Scout Council from all of the city councils included in the Juniper area for the selling door-to-door of Girl Scout cookies in the annual sale which begins at 4 p.m. on Friday, April 2. The Juniper Girl Scout Council cookie sale includes the active participation of the Brownies, the Junior Girl Scouts, the Cadettes and the Senior Girl Scouts, in the areas of Klamath, Jefferson, Deschutes and Crook counties in Oregon and parts of Siskiyou and Modoc counties in California.

Girls participating in the sale will offer to the public three kinds of cookies: Chocolate, Savannahs and cream-filled. The sale was developed by the national headquarters as a means to supplement the United Fund allotment to the local council. Ten per cent of the sale profits will be designated for the individual troops in the council while the remainder will be used directly to support the camp program at Camp Esther Applegate at Lake of the Woods.

Because the cookie sale monies are used directly for the local camp program, it is possible for the Juniper Girl Scout Council to offer camping to more girls at a lower price than any of the other councils in the region.

The girls participating in the sale will travel in pairs in a house-to-house canvass during a 22-day campaign which ends April 23.
