

DST Stand Threatened

LAKEWOOD, Colo. (UPI)—Mrs. Ruth Stockton, a Colorado state senator, was not deterred in her efforts to push for daylight savings, despite repeated threats against her life.

"You couldn't have things like this affecting the course of legislation," the Lakewood Republican said after revealing Sunday that she has received four telephone calls from a man who said he would kill her if the daylight savings bill becomes law.

Mrs. Stockton said the man, who she describes as "cowardly and unbalanced," called twice Friday night and twice Saturday night.

Mrs. Stockton's daughter, Alexe, said one threat was phrased: "Just remember, Ruth dies if we go on daylight savings time before the 1966 election."

Mrs. Stockton was the main proponent of the bill in the senate. The bill is now on Gov. John A. Love's desk after both houses passed it. The bill would place Colorado on daylight savings April 25 for a two-year trial period. The proposal would be put to the electorate in 1966.

Mrs. Stockton said, "I think the person who called is unbalanced and not a kid. But I think anyone who does this is cowardly and there is nothing to be alarmed at all."

Mrs. Stockton said she couldn't find any one else in the legislature who received threatening calls. Main opposition to the bill came from farmers and ranchers and representatives of motion picture theaters.

Under the measure, daylight savings would take effect April 25 and last until the final Sunday in October.

Negroes Planning New Registration Protests

SELMA, Ala. (UPI) — Negroes have been comparatively quiet recently, with only minor demonstrations occurring at Camden and Marion.

Negro leaders in Selma said demonstrations were curtailed since the dramatic "right-to-vote" march to Montgomery last month.

There also was expected to be an attempt by Negroes to register at Camden, 35 miles away.

Today was one of the twice-monthly voter registration days in Dallas and Wilcox, two of the black South belt counties where the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, headed by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., has conducted a Negro voter registration campaign for the past 10 weeks.

Tax Service To Extend Sympathies

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will give "sympathetic consideration" to persons who have found last year's tax-cut to be this year's tax problem.

The agency said during the weekend that taxpayers who would suffer "undue hardship" by paying Uncle Sam all the income taxes they owe on April 15 will be permitted to pay after the deadline.

However, the agency said it would be up to the local IRS office to determine who might be a hardship case, and it warned taxpayers against delaying full payment for their own personal convenience. Legal action to force immediate payment could result, it said.

Problems in meeting this year's income tax deadline have generally been attributed to the 1964 tax cut, aimed at strengthening the nation's economy and letting the wage earner bring home more money per week.

Millions of Americans—including President Johnson—have discovered that their payroll withholding was not enough to cover their 1964 federal income tax.

Circuit Solicitor Earl Morgan, a close political ally of Gov. George Wallace, disclosed over the weekend that he was drafting legislation making it harder to obtain dynamic and making the illegal possession of dynamite a felony. Morgan said he expected to have his legislation ready for the next General Assembly session in May.

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All Moviedom Convenes For Academy Awards Presentations

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—Movie stars from around the world converged on Hollywood today for the 37th annual Academy Awards, distinguished by the return to popularity of big, glossy musicals.

"My Fair Lady," "Mary Poppins" and "The Unsinkable Molly Brown" were among the leaders for awards tonight and provided a trio of glamor queens for the presentations: Audrey Hepburn, Julie Andrews and Debbie Reynolds.

Both Fair Lady and Poppins are competing for best picture. Miss Andrews and Miss Reynolds are nominees for best actress. And Miss Hepburn will present the Oscar to this year's winning actor.

Backstage excitement was anticipated in a face-to-face meeting of Miss Andrews and Miss Hepburn, who was not nominated for best actress in the role of Eliza Doolittle in Fair Lady, the role which made a Broadway star of Miss Andrews. The actresses have been a center of controversy since Warner Bros. selected Miss Hepburn for the part.

In addition to Miss Andrews and Miss Reynolds, the nominated actresses are Sophia Loren (Marriage Italian Style), Anne Bancroft (The Pumpkin Eaters) and Kim Stanley (Satan's Wife).

Best picture nominations went to "Zorba the Greek," "Beverly Hills Cop," "The Godfather," "The Sound of Music" and "The Longest Day."

Competing for best actor are Rex Harrison (Fair Lady), Anthony Quinn (Zorba), Peter Sellers (Strangelove), Peter O'Toole and Richard Burton (Becket).

ICE LITTER

NEW YORK (UPI)—Ice fishermen are urged not to follow the bad example of land-bound litterbugs.
