# AGAINST ARMY OF GOVENMENT

SHANGHAI, Sept. 22 .- (United News) - General Lu Hslangs Cheklang troops still were in control of Shanghai today holding out against the Klangsu armies which were attacking the city despite the desertions and the great superiority of the en-emy forces. There was widely scattered fighting over the week-end. General Chi Hsies Yuas ev-idently withholding his main forces in the hopes that the defenders would either surrender or abandon Shanghai without further fighting. Lu however, appeared determined to fight to the last and rejected the new ap-peal of the Shanghai merchants for an armistice.
