KLAMATH WILL MEET BOYS OF GRANTS PASS

Klamath and Grants Pass high football teams meet this afternoon at Modoc park, this being the second game of the season for the Klamath boys.

The Grants Pass team will arrive some time this morning coming some 25 strong with players and substitutes. The local boys expect a hard fought battle but have confidence in their ability to put up a good game with winning chances.

The Klamath line-up is as follows: Christy, captain and quarterback; Turner full back; Johnson, right half; Peltz, right end; Beckley, left end; Sabo, right tackle; Yancy, left tackle; Cofey, right guard; Upp, left guard; Soule, center; Maguire, Barnes, Smith, Colson, Loomis and Kermin, substitutes.

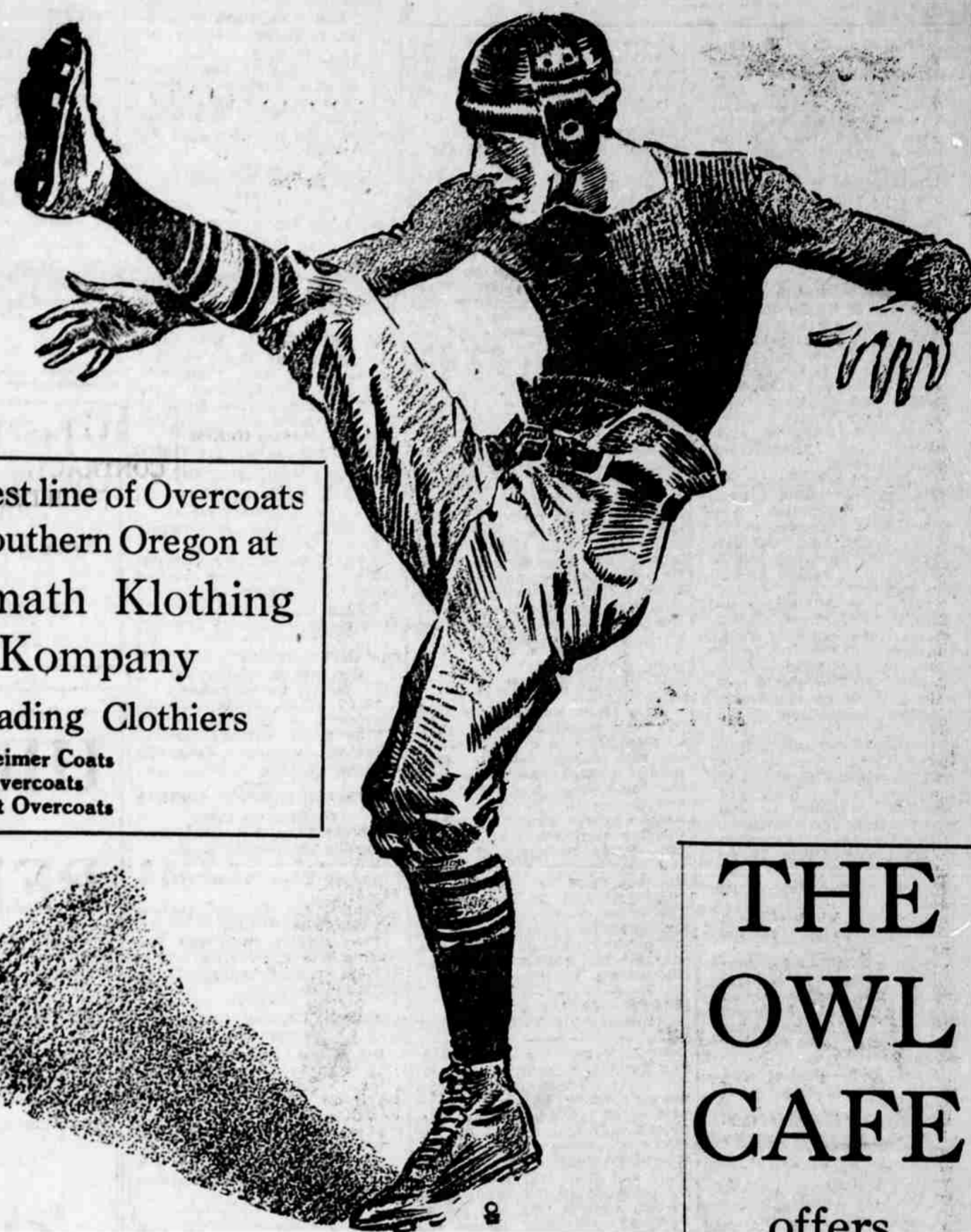

HAUL WATER TO DEER TO SAVE THEIR LIVES

It having been determined to the satisfaction of the game wardens of Klamath and Modoc counties that the deer dying near Hackamore springs are poisoned by eating alkali impregnated mud State Game Warden A. E. Burghdoff has authorized the hauling of water there for the deer.

The loss of life among the male deer in the vicinity of Hackamore springs may be as many as 200 and the sick deer are numerous there now. Troughs will be placed and the water hauled there daily until sufficient rains fall to take care of the situation. W. M. McNealy received the telegram from Burghdoff authorizing action in the matter of hauling water to the deer.
