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Francis X. Bushman Sued For a Divorce By Beverly Bayne

LOS ANGELES, April 21.—Beverly Bayne, film actress, has filed suit for divorce against Francis X. Bushman, known in early cinema days as "the perfect lover."

Miss Bayne's complaint, filed Monday, charges desertion and asks the custody of the couple's minor child, Richard.

The Bushmans were married in New York July 28, 1918, after being featured together for several years in screen productions. According to Miss Bayne, Bushman left her without her consent on February 24, 1924.

Several months ago when the actor returned from a European engagement the separation was admitted but divorce proceedings were not mentioned.
