WHEELER CASE TO JURY FRIDAY

GRAND FALLS, Mont., April 23.—Arguments in the trial of Senator Burton K. Wheeler on a charge of misuse of office are expected to be concluded in time for the case to go to the jury Friday.

The defense abruptly brought its case to a close this afternoon and the prosecution started to open its arguments when Federal Judge Frank S. Dietrich adjourned court for the night.

Attorneys for the defense agreed to end the case when it was learned that it was impossible to trace records in Washington, D. C. concerning certain telephone calls involved in testimony brought out in the trial.

The defense was seeking to obtain the records with which they hoped to impeach the testimony of George H. Hayes, star prosecution witness.

Resumption of the trial came late in the afternoon after a recess during most of the day while telegrams from the telephone company offices in Washington were awaited.

Practically the entire morning session before the recess was taken up by the prosecution in cross-examining Wheeler.

The prosecution announced the following witnesses had been called to testify to the character of Hayes, but had been notified not to come since the case was ended.

William B. Wilcox, former chairman of the republican national committee; Lewis Pichea, New York architect; Charles T. Craig, comptroller of New York city.

Alex Lehman, assistant district attorney of New York, who was to testify for the defense regarding Hayes' character was also notified not to come.

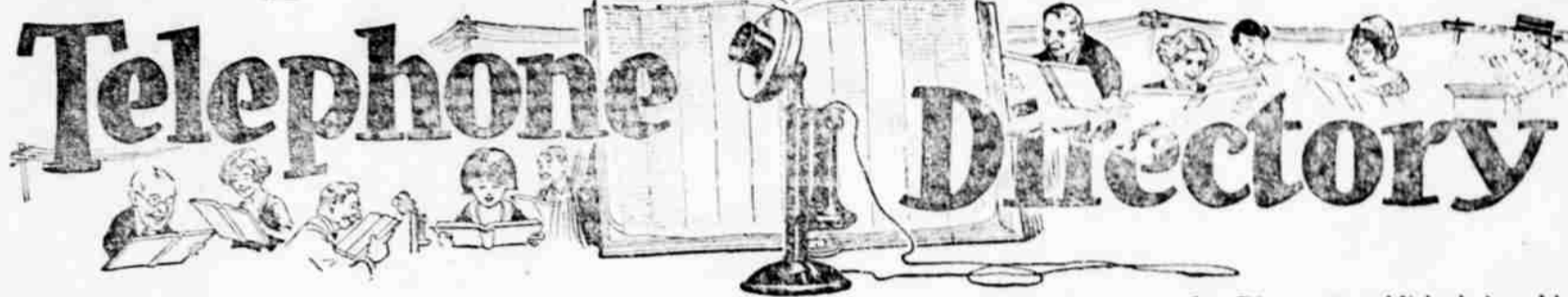
