COOLIDGE'S FATHER UNDERGOES AN EXAM

BOSTON, May 1.—Col. John Coolidge, father of the president, returned to his home at Plymouth, Vt., Friday afternoon after undergoing examinations by two Boston medical specialists.

Col. Coolidge, who has been in poor health for several months was examined at the Massachusetts general hospital by a heart specialist and later by Dr. Arthur L. Chute, associate professor of genito-urinary surgery at Tufts medical school.

Dr. Paul White at the Massachusetts general hospital said the president's father had "heart block" resulting in a slow pulse a condition often found with advancing age. Dr. Chute made no report concerning the results of the examination he made.
