Ever since Carpenter cashed a slip for \$200,000 in return for a slap on the neck, the native sucker list has been rather shy of fighters from other countries. Eddie Mascart came here to ask for a fuss with Kid Kaplan, but he was shunted out to Cleveland first to show what he could do, which was nothing, not against a boy named Al Corbett.

Mascart lost on fouls, and of course he will now take rank with the rabble of native featherweights.

Carpenter got away with something, but most of the immigrants are asked to carry the hod awhile before being taken into championship society.

Ted Lewis, from London, was a great fighter while he lasted, and he fought every step of the way to the welterweight championship, receiving no special consideration because he had European stickers on his valise. Freddie Welsh had to make good in the same way.

Ermino Spalla was sent against Gene Tunney, who is no champion, and public interest in him abated sharply, so sharply that he went back to Italy with all possible haste.

Romero Rojas has taken a clout on the nose for every dollar he has received in this country, and Luis Vincentini was taken along a pretty tough alley and hoist by the hard characters of the lightweight class.

Last year Ted Moore and Roland Todd, two fancy middleweight fighters from England, were asked to whip the lads in the back room as a preliminary to better matches, and Moore poked his way up to a match with Harry Greb, who whipped him.

Firpo, of course, made a fortune, but Firpo was an extraordinary showman, like Carpenter and Dempsey. And even Luis Angel had to tip over a long line of test tubes before his ship tied up at the dock and unloaded gold for the Argentine.

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
