FEDERAL APPRAISER TO START WORK HERE SOON

Word has just been received by the Klamath Falls National Farm Loan association that G. H. Hixon, Jr., federal appraiser, is expected in Klamath Falls during the next few days to appraise lands offered as security for federal farm loans.

Mrs. L. B. Hogue, who was a delegate to the recent convention at Spokane, reports that the federal land bank there has had a very successful year and that it has about \$1,000,000 in loans to the farmers of the 12th district. The loans in Klamath county have been made to about 200 farmers and aggregate approximately \$100,000. The bank has never yet foreclosed a mortgage in Klamath county.

CIVIL SERVICE EXAMS. TO BE GIVEN IN K. F.

The United States Civil Service commission has called attention to the fact that in examinations held recently in Klamath Falls and other cities throughout the country for teacher of home economics (vocational grades), teachers of home economics (junior vocational grades), and principal of home economics, to fill vacancies in the Indian service, applicants were not secured in the number desired, and that these examinations will be held again. Receipt of applications will close May 29. The date for the assembling of competitors will be stated on the admission cards sent to applicants after the close of receipt of applications.

Persons interested in these or other examinations should apply to the Secretary of the United States Civil Service Board at the local post office for detailed information and application blanks.
