Earle Sande Crosses Line A Winner In Neck And Neck Race

CHURCHILL DOWNS, LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 16.—Earl Sande rode Gifford Cochran's coal black colt Flying Ebony, to victory in the fifty-first Kentucky derby here this afternoon.

The victory was won by a length and a half. A nose behind Captain Hal, dodging the two leaders from the beginning of the race, Sheriff Dan Scott's homebred Kentucky colt, son of John, finished third.

These three dominated the running from the start to finish. The victory of Flying Ebony gives Cochran a double crown.
