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World Needn't Worry Over Explorers For A Fortnight Or More

COPENHAGEN, May 27.—"A fortnight may elapse before the world needs to worry over Amundsen," Knud Rasmussen, the Danish explorer, said today upon his arrival from the United States. Suggesting that Amundsen might leave his airships and begin a march to Greenland, Rasmussen said there might be no reason to send help before next year.

"The only reason for nervousness is that people expect news too soon," Rasmussen said. "Flying is easier in the summer, but landing is difficult, as the ice is covered with snow and water throughout the summer. Amundsen will not dare leave his airplanes behind, as the ice is always moving and it would be difficult to find the planes."

Rasmussen pointed out that if Amundsen was not able to continue in his aircraft, he and his party must walk 500 miles to the nearest land.

"If he walks to west Greenland," the Danish explorer continued, "the world may receive no news before May, 1926. If he tries to reach east Greenland, it may be September, 1926, before there is news from him."
