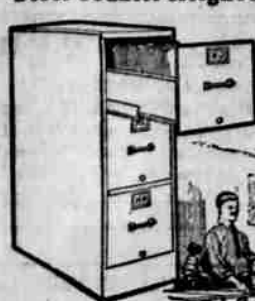
**RESOLUTION**  
**Ninth Street Pavement—Number 39**  
The City Engineer, pursuant to  
resolution of the Common Council  
heretofore adopted, having on the  
4th day of May, 1925, filed plans,  
specifications and estimates of the  
cost of improving 9th street from  
Pine street northerly to High  
street, excluding intersections on  
either end thereof, and the Council  
having taken same under advisement  
and finding said plans, speci-  
fications and estimates to be satis-  
factory:  
BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that  
said plans, specifications and esti-  
mates for the improvement of the  
said portion of Ninth street be and  
the same are hereby approved; and  
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED  
that the Common Council hereby  
declares its intention to improve  
said portion of Ninth street in ac-  
cordance with the said plans, speci-  
fications and estimates. Said im-  
provement shall consist of paving  
said portion of said street with con-  
crete pavement, Warrenite Bitul-  
thic pavement with rock base, War-  
renite Bitulthic pavement with bitu-  
minous concrete base, asphaltic  
concrete pavement with rock base,  
or asphaltic concrete pavement with  
asphaltic concrete base, at an esti-  
mated cost, including curbing, gut-  
ters and drainage, and a five foot  
sidewalk on the westerly side there-  
of only, for concrete pavement,  
Warrenite Bitulthic pavement with  
rock base, or asphaltic concrete  
pavement with rock base, of \$3,-  
295.60, and for Warrenite bitulthic  
pavement with bituminous concrete  
base, or asphaltic concrete pavement  
with asphaltic concrete base, of  
\$3,445.20; said pavement in either  
event to include grading, rolling  
and curbing, and drainage; said  
pavement to be of the width and di-  
mensions shown on the plans and  
specifications of the City Engineer  
on file with the Police Judge, in
