

## WEEK OR MORE CAMPING TRIP IS SCOUT PLAN

Boys who have joined or who have identified their intentions of joining the Klamath Falls troops of Boy Scouts, may well be assured of an enjoyable summer. If plans now under way are carried out, the summer camp which will be held during the month of July holds a week or several weeks of outdoor life for the scouts and now Cecil A. Cook, scout executive for the Crater Lake council has obtained the services of Captain O. C. Applegate who will assist him in outlining hikes and excursions for the scouts which will take them to historical and interesting spots in Klamath county. Time has made the landmarks of the Indian wars more interesting and Captain Applegate will make the scout executive in mapping out trips which will include many of the most attractive places. One of the spots to be located, or rather an attempt will be made to locate it, is the position of the first cabin built at Lake of the Woods, which will, if found probably be the site for the boy scout cabin this summer.

Tomorrow night in the Presbyterian church the newly chosen scout masters will receive their preliminary instructions for the summer's work.

Recently a contest was instigated among members of the seven Medford troops to make up display boards with various kinds of knots made from rope, knots both useful and ornamental. The board containing the largest number of knots selected was to decorate the scout headquarters in the Methodist church. Troop No. 4 won the contest with 156 different types of knots in the board. After troops in Klamath Falls are sufficiently organized to permit a contest of this kind, similar work will be carried out among the local boys, the chosen board to decorate the scout cabin during the summer.

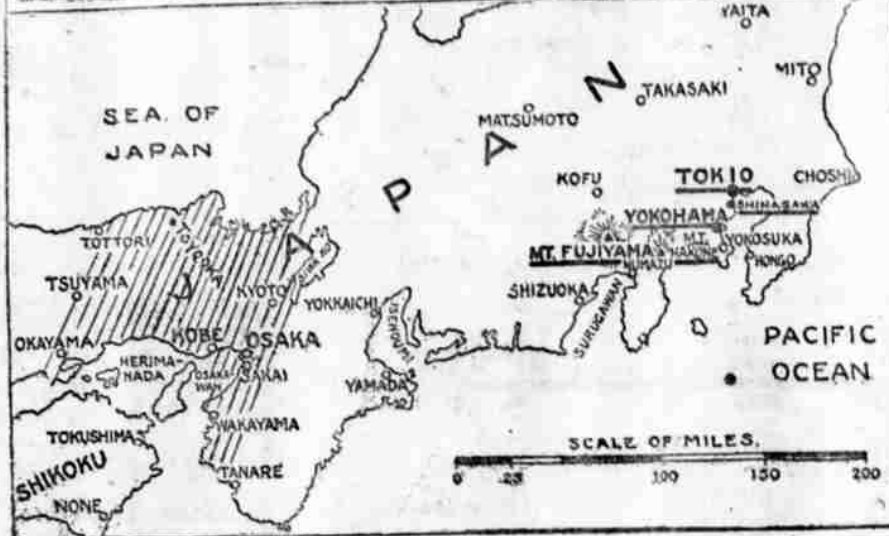
